

## 4000 CHICKS ARRIVE

## ARMY-NAVY STUDENT TEST

Qualifying tests for the specialized training of men for the Army Navy College will be held at the Poston I secondary school on May 15. It was disclosed the purpose of this school is to obtain outstanding students for future specialists, technicians and officers in the armed forces.

Students passing the qualifying tests will be able to choose a course from a wide variety of courses that is being offered.

Candidates must be a high school senior who will graduate by July 1, 1944 or a high school graduate between the ages of 17 and 22 and of good health.

Interested persons should apply at the secondary school principal's office in each unit not later than this Saturday, Feb. 12.

Word has come from John H. Provinse, Acting Director in Washington that a three-man relocation team will arrive in Poston about February 28 for a five day visit. Scheduled to be on the team are Harold Fister of the Cleveland relocation office, Robert M. Cullum of the New York office and Abe Fischler of the Washington Reports Di-

vision.

They will be preceded here by two WRA officers, one from the St. Louis area and the other from the Washington Reports Division who will arrive about February 14 for a three day stay during which they will help plan details of the team's program.

As announced previously, the team whose purpose it will be to stimulate interest in relocation will not indulge in "high pressure" tactics but will tie in their work very closely with the local relocation program so that their activities "can be regarded as an integral part of the work now being done in the center."

Tentative plans of the team include public evening meetings which will probably be accompanied by special movies "The Way Ahead" and "Go For Broke" after-noon meetings with special groups, and morning conferences with individuals and families about personal relocation problems and specific outside placement opportunities.

Two relocation officers will follow the team and will remain in the center for two weeks during which they will be available for personal interviews and special meetings.
