## UNIT I WATER NOT DRINKABLE NEXT WEDNESDAY AND MONDAY

TO BE STRONGLY CHLORINATED TO CLEAN PIPES

Chlorine contents of the Unit I water supply will be extremely high this Wednesday, Feb. 16 and again on Monday, Feb. 21, for the purpose of clearing out all Unit I's water lines of bacteria for the benefit of the residents, stated R. T. Nishimoto of the health and sanitation department.

Center residents should have an ample supply of drinking water stored before the chlorination starts and tap water should not be taken during

this period. In case of emergency, the water will be made drinkable by boiling 20 minutes. Fish pond water should be closed as fishes will be killed.

Persons with sensitive skin are advised by Mr. Nishimoto not to take showers during this period as itchy-ness of the skin may result from the chlorine. Kitchens are advised to store water for cooking purposes.

The schedule of the chlorination is as follows and water should not be consumed during this period: Tues. 10 p.m. to Wed. 5 p.m. and Sun. 10 p.m. to Mon. 5 p.m.

## BENEFIT DANCE DATE SET FOR TUBERCULOSIS PATIENTS

In order to help the Poston patients at the Phoenix Indian Sanitarium, the Stardusters will hold a Benefit Ball on Saturday, February 19, at the school assembly hall.

This ball is believed to be the first of its kind given by a center organization, all proceeds going to make the stay of local tuberculosis patients in Phoenix as pleasant as possible. Although there will be no door-to-door soliciting, any sort of monetary contribution will be gladly accepted to increase the amount of the fund.

Music is scheduled to be provided by the Poston II swing orchestra. As to other Poston activities, all visiting servicemen and their companions are warmly invited free of charge.

Regular admissions will be 40¢ per couple and 50¢ per singles.

## RAILWAY JOBS OPEN IN MONTANA

If there are residents who want to go a-wukkin' on the railroad, the Great Northern Railway Company of Montana is offering 62¢ an hour for extra gang laborers and section gang laborers.

The work includes, among other things, placing ties and servicing tracks, and pays time-and-a-half in excess of 8 hours. These are the basic rates, and all rates of pay are based on experience rather than seniority.

Extra gang workers will be given free housing in regular railroad outfit cars, while section gang laborers will be housed free at regular section headquarters. If bedding is supplied by the boarding contractors, there will be a charge of 35¢ an hour

for furnishing and laundering it. Laborers will be provided their own board and adequate kitchen equipment is provided without charge.

Those interested in this opportunity are asked to contact their unit relocation offices immediately.
