## AGRICULTURAL WAR UNIT DEFINED

Because agricultural production is considered the only defensible occupation, residents who are planning farm resettlement are given the following information as to what constitutes one war unit. Sixteen of these units are required for deferment.

A war unit is a measure of production of essential farm production. One acre in beets, carrots, onions

## WRA UNDER DEPT. OF INTERIOR ACCORDING TO PRESIDENTIAL ORDER

WASHINGTON, FEB. 16 (via Teletype)--President Roosevelt announced today that he had ordered the transfer of the War Relocation Authority to the Department of the Interior. WRA has responsibility for maintenance and relocation of persons of Japanese descent evacuated from the Pacific Coast early in 1942. The transfer is being made for reasons of administrative simplification and to bring the work of the agency under supervision of a cabinet officer. The agency, of which Dillon S. Myer is Director, will be moved in its entirety into

the Department of the Interior, in accordance with the President's frequently announced belief that the number of independent agencies should, when practicable, be reduced.

In announcing the transfer the President stated that he considered the program of the WAR RELOCATION AUTHORITY.

## REMINDER TO REPATRIATES

Because there is the possibility of another exchange with Japan, the WRA wishes to keep its repatriation and expatriation records complete and accurate.

Therefore, both those residents who have asked for repatriation but who no longer desire to go to Japan, and those who desire to go to Japan and who have not applied for repatriation, are asked to contact their unit family welfare offices promptly.

It is emphasized that it will be very difficult, if not impossible, for persons to get their names removed once they have been accepted for exchange by the Japanese Government.

## OVER 3000 LEAVE CENTER

Indefinite leaves from the Colorado River War Relocation Center now number over 3000, the population bureau reported last Wednesday, February 16.

Tuesday night departures totalled 42, bringing the grand total of indefinite leaves up to 3021.

With 328 persons out on seasonal leave, 81 on short-term leaves, and 100 on miscellaneous leaves, Poston's remaining population as of midnight February 15, was 13,433.

## WAR UNIT DEFINED

(cont. from page 1) that a given production, whether it be a single animal or a single acre of special type production, bears to a war unit. For instance, 1 acre of wheat is .50 of a war unit; 1 acre of onions is 1.00 of a war unit, and 1 acre of strawberries is 1.50 of a war unit.

The number of acres or given to a type of production or the number of animals of a specified type multiplied by the conversion factor results in the war unit value. For example, 3 range cattle multiplied by the conversion factor of .07 results in .21 war unit; while 19 acres of Irish potatoes multiplied by the conversion factor of .50 is equivalent to 9.50 war units.

Persons who wish more specific information of a war unit may contact their unit employment offices where war unit tables of essential farm products are available.

The unit Selective Service advisory boards will, as far as they are able, assist all persons with individual arrangement problems.

The WAR RELOCATION AUTHORITY operate nine relocation centers, for those of the evacuees who have been found to be loyal American citizens or law abiding aliens and a segregation center for those whose loyalties are to Japan rather than to the United States. A total of 92,000 evacuees are in the ten centers. Approximately 20,000 evacuees have resettled in ordinary communities outside the evacuated zone through the relocation program of the agency.

He was Sgt. Jimmie Gozawa who, in the hushed chamber of the Colorado legislature said:

"I am an American by birth, and it means a great deal to me. It is almost impossible for you to understand this titanic struggle, sitting here comfortably. There are thousands of people who are suffering and dying—not because they are black or white, Japanese or something else—but because they are believers in democracy. We are going overseas. We are going to be hungry, many of us are going to be crippled.

"We are not asking for special privileges. We are only asking for a chance to show that we do believe in democracy, that it is dear to us.

"Please give us hope that our loved ones here will be taken care of."

With Gozawa were two nisei soldiers who had served six months in the Aleutians.

Sgt. Gozawa was inducted at San Francisco in 1941 where he had operated a flower shop, and had been en route Camp Savage, Minnesota at the time he appeared at the House.

Also included in the pictures are married Japanese ladies taking gym relaxation in "Ladies Day Out" which is a day when St. Paul women gather for the classes and programs together with Caucasian ladies while their children are taken cared by the nursery. There seems to be not the slightest indication of racial prejudice in work or social life there. In St. Paul Sunday Pioneer Press Rotogravure Section of Jan. 16, 1944, an article called "Americans racing a Problem" with photos of Japanese American girls in their work as beauticians, hospital workers, telephone operators, torch singer house girls, etc. shows the tolerance of the people in this area and their understanding to our problems.

## ICKES WELCOMES DIRECTOR MYER

Secretary of Interior Harold I. Ickes is issued the following statement relating the transfer of the WRA to the Department of Interior a few days ago.

"The President has directed that the War Relocation Authority be transferred to the Department of the Interior. I am glad to welcome the director and staff of the War Relocation Authority into this department. The Authority was established nearly two years ago as a result of the Army's evacuation of West Coast residents of Japanese ancestry. Since that time the Authority has worked closely with this department. Five relocation centers are situated on Interior Department land, one center was directly administered by this Department until January 1, 1944. As a consequence I know something of the problems with which the War Relocation Authority has been confronted and have come to appreciate the effectiveness with which these problems have been dealt.

"War Relocation Authority has been confronted with the difficult task of caring for a minority group of enemy ancestry in time of war. To handle this problem with proper regard for the national security and in accord with sound principles of American Democracy the Authority has developed a three-fold program: 1. Maintenance of all evacuees who require support in properly administered relocation centers; 2. Segregation of evacuees whose sympathies do not lie with the United States into a special segregation center; and 3. Relocation of loyal evacuees as rapidly as possible in normal productive American life. This program will be continued and I hope will be made even more effective in the Department of the Interior.

"In carrying out my responsibilities under the order I intend to keep in mind the need of recognition of the rights of United States citizens regardless of ancestry, the internal security of the United States during war time and the international implications which are involved, and particularly the effect of this program on the treatment of war prisoners and civilians in Japanese hands.

"The Department of Interior will, I am sure, be able to make an effective contribution to the relocation program. I should be reluctant, however, to assume the responsibilities involved in bringing the War Relocation Authority into the Department of Interior if I did not know the ability and devotion of the staff of the War Relocation Authority and were not assured that Dillon Myer and the organization he

## MYER COMMENTS ON CHANGE

In commenting today on the transfer of the War Relocation Authority to the Department of the Interior, WRA Director Dillon S. Myer said:

"The War Relocation Authority was created by the President almost two years ago to perform a necessary wartime task aimed at preserving our American democratic principles and at the same time protecting the national security. The program which we have developed to meet the needs of 110,000 American residents, two thirds of them citizens by right of birth, has had the endorsement of the congress as well as the executive branch of the government. Our primary objective is to see that it is carried out in the most effective manner. We welcome the resources and facilities which will be available in the Department of Interior to help us do our job and do it better."

"I know that Secretary Ickes and I can depend upon the continued loyalty of the WRA staff and a continuation of the good relations between residents of the centers and the staff which have been enjoyed in the past."
