The ARTS COUNCIL, composed of anti fascist Japanese American artists active in all fields of creative endeavor states that it is "keenly aware that the atrocities committed against our sold iers by the Japanese imperialists. like e very other fascist crime must be avenged Every leader of the Tascist i mperia list clique must be held ac for it is countable have perpe. they who trated these crimes not only against Amer icans but also against the people of Japan "
