HEARING BOARD

With 22 active hearing board members holding about 15 sittings a week in the three units for the last ten weeks, there have been 75-100 cases heard weekly. About seven expatriate cases or five Washington dockets have been averaged in one hearing.

In spite of this heavy scheduling it has been reported that leave clearance hearings have been bogging down because of three reasons two of which are remediable

(1) Board members cannot be asked to sit more often than they have been doing.

D.C. DECISIONS 265 CLEARANCES

Decisions from the leave clearance review board in Washington total 265, as of March 8, according to James D. Crawford, executive secretary of the local hearing board.

A total of 1171 cases have been returned to Washington, and an additional 200, already heard, are being processed. There remain about 100 dockets on hand which

have yet to be heard, and more are expected shortly from Washington.

Scott Rowley, new project attorney, is the latest addition to the hearing board, which now numbers 25 members.

STORAGE FEES DUE ON URNS

Storage fee for all ashes of the deceased formerly left at the Los Angeles Nishi Hongwanji Temple and now stored at the Evergreen Cemetery vaults will become due this month, according to a letter received from Sanford Sato, Bussoi leader.

The contract with the Evergreen Cemetery expires on Mar. 18. All who have stored their relatives or friends ashes there should write to Rev. Julius A. Goldwater, 532 Bonhill Road, Los Angeles, 24, Calif. by Mar. 14, stating what should be done.

Those who wish to have their urns kept at the Evergreen vaults must enclose the same fee as before whereas, those wishing the urns to be sent them may do so by paying the necessary expenses.

CHICAGO ISSUES INVITATION

Paul Dougherty, Chicago district relocation officer, has issued a blanket invitation to all evacuees who wish to resettle in Chicago. James D. Crawford, relocation chief, reports.

This makes it unnecessary for the relocates to first get permission from the Chicago Office as in previous cases.

Chicago Ill. (Special). Two Japanese American girls will be considered for U.S. Cadet Nurse Corps training at Mount Sinai hospital, Chicago for the next class which will begin in June. It was announced this week by Gladys Sandvig, R.N. director of nurses at the hospital and Vernon R. Kennedy, Chicago area supervisor of the W.R.A.

Girls wanting to apply for admission to the training school can obtain further information by writing to the director of nurses at Mount Sinai hospital, California av. at 15th pl., Chicago 8 Ill.

In general the candidate must be at least 18 years old or within two months of 18, must be a high school graduate and in good health.

Highlights of the U.S. Cadet Nurse Corps include free complete nursing education, free tuition fees and maintenance, monthly allowances of money out of door winter and summer uniforms and upon graduation eligibility to take state examinations to become Registered Nurses.

Rochdale Principle

VII Constant Education

The Rochdale weavers decided early in their struggle to establish a store that it was of utmost importance to have all their members thoroughly understand the principles and policies under which their store should be run. Accordingly they set aside a certain amount of their yearly earnings to be used in carrying vital information to the people who had already joined, and to promote the idea among non-members. In cooperative business where the members have the final say it is important that their voting be based on thorough understanding of the questions in hand.

Some 6,000 members through their votes control the Poston Cooperative. Just as it is important that people who vote in a democracy should thoroughly understand the policies and procedures of their government, so it is important that these 6,000 members be conversant with the Rochdale principles, the by-laws, and all essential facts about their cooperative. By constant education, the people "raise their sights" to include new fields of cooperative endeavor such as wholesales and manufacturing.

Rochdale principles, by-laws, and a constitution do not guarantee that a society will be democratic. The progress of the society depends on the amount of thinking and actual decisions the people themselves make so that in the end it is the individual who is the strength of his society. Given the necessary facts, he must then think them through himself. The Rochdale pioneers believed like Michel Angelo that "he who does not think for himself dishonors his soul."

"SERVICES ARE NEXT STEP" SAYS RICHARDSON

At the regular meeting of the Board of Directors held Feb. 28th, Mr. Richardson, Wash. Head of C.E., was present. He paid tribute to the development of the enterprises in the following words:

"Reviewing the work of the cooperatives, we see one of the most rapid developments of business you could find in the history of business. The people responsible have to be complimented. Complimented chiefly because they started off without capital, without anything and they built up, as time went on without any capital, by going under their own steam, and from credit from outside agencies and firms. The thing looks so good at most of the centers that it is a great temptation to feel good about it and to just go on now the way the enterprises are organized. The period of rapid expansion, of setting up new services, and the opening of new stores is over. We have entered into the next most important period. It is doing well and making good profits. It is now the time to make it more and more efficient, and to figure out new ways of serving the people. The cooperative stands in a peculiar position on the project. It is a large business run by a group of people that all the residents
