CONSTRUCTION OF PONDS FOR FISH CULTURE BEGINS WEDNESDAY

The Dept. of Fish Culture reported that the actual work on the construction of a pond for fish culture will start Wednesday, July 8. A crew of 30 men will be needed.

The following is a report which was made on the work accomplished up to date:

The first meeting of the Fish Culture Division was held on May 29, with Mr. Jorgensen as the main speaker. The various possibilities for fish propagation at Poston were discussed, and a committee headed by Mr. Akiyama of the Pacific Gold Fish Farm was selected to look into the possibilities of constructing a fish pond to stock such fish as bass, catfish, perch, and carp.

Because of uncertainty of site and other complications, they weren't able to call a general meeting until July 6.

The actual planning and research started about June 16, when a possible site was planned.

FACTORY COMMITTEE REPORT

The factory planning committee reports that the plans for a "tofu" and tsukemono factory are progressing satisfactorily.

The locale will presumably be on the south side of Camp No. 1. Other factories are being proposed and is being tentatively considered.

Those with any experience in manufacturing the above mentioned products or those with suggestions to aid in the planning are requested to help.

HEATERS FOR THE SCHOOLS PLANNED

Distributing of oil burning heaters are being planned for the classrooms and the auditoriums in the three elementary and two high schools to be opened in the fall, according to Mr. Popkins, Director of Construction and Maintenance.

In utilizing two large heaters in each of the auditoriums, the air from the outside will be drawn inside, filtered and blown inside making a complete change of air every three minutes. Three auditoriums in the elementary schools will hold 500, while the two high school audi-

toriums will seat 1200.

There will be heaters in the apartments also, but are not being planned as yet, although the chimneys are being distributed.

NEW FIRE DEPT. EQUIPMENT ARRIVES

The Poston Fire Dept. are proud owners of a new fire truck and equipment, that arrived last Monday morning, July 6.

The fire fighting equipment that arrived includes a 1942 Ford fire truck with 1450 ft. of various size hose. The truck is equipped with a pressure pump which will boast the water pressure from the fire hydrant to 300 cubic inches, if necessary.

Yesterday, three ace firemen from the Los Angeles Fire Dept. were here giving the firemen instructions on the operation of the equipment.

"Today we are with a new fire truck, a truck we all can be proud of, but this is no sign of carelessness on the part of the community," declared Fire Chief Tom Nishimoto. We must uphold the fine record.
