A new law, the Rabbit and Poultry Regulation adopted by the Community Council was approved COUNCIL ADOPTS PROCEDURE FOR NEWORIALS

Local or dity councils will be the sponsorers of all future memorial services to be held for deceased Nisei soldiers according to a procedure adopted by the Community Council recently.

The following procedure was adopted: (1) City Council or Local Council to be sponsor-er (2) Floral wreaths to be accepted only accepted only from the administration, each unit council and family of the deceased. (3) Memori-(chojî) al addresses miliadministration, tary police and city council; (chobun) unit councils. (4) Address of thanks by the Chairrepresenting the man, representing the family of the deceased sponsorer. (5) and Service shall be in any religious denomination and the locale of the service shall be left to the discretion of the sponsor. (6) Any type of garb to be worn by those attending the service

The new regulation which becomes effective May 1, sets forth that it shall be unlawful for any person to breed, keep or maintain live rabbits or poultry within a distance of 100 feet of any building occupied by human being.

Persons violating the regulation and upon conviction will be fined not more than \$300 or imprisoned in the project jail not to exceed 90 days or both.

San Diego, Preparation of escheatment proceedings against Japanese-owned properties in San Diego County was under way last week after conferences between Dist. Atty. Thomas Whelen and Everett Mattoon, Deputy State Attorney General, according to the Los angeles Times.

When filed in Superior Court, the proceedings will allege that the property involved 20 farms valued at almost \$200,000---was acquired fraudulently, in violation of the Alien Land Laws, Whe-

lan said.

If it can be proved that alien Japanese fraudulently placed title of the land in the name of other persons eligible to own property, the land would revert back to the State, he explained.
