151 MEN EXAMINED

In the second Poston mass pre-induction physicals, 151 residents and one visitor were examined by the visiting medical team last Sunday, April 16, according to available reports.

There were 158 scheduled, but six were ill and one person refused to appear.

COUNCIL ADOPTS PROCEDURE FOR MEMORIALS

Local or city councils will be the sponsors of all future memorial services to be held for deceased Nisei soldiers according to a procedure adopted by the Community Council recently.

The following procedure was adopted: (1) City Council or Local Council to be sponsor. (2) Floral wreaths to be accepted only from the administration, each unit council and family of the deceased. (3) Memorial addresses (choji) administration, military police and city council; (chobun) unit councils. (4) Address of thanks by the Chairman, representing the family of the deceased and sponsor. (5) Service shall be in any religious denomination and the locale of the service shall be left to the discretion of the sponsor. (6) Any type of garb to be worn by those attending the service

SURVEY REVEALS RESIDENTS INTEND TO REMAIN IN CENTER

In the recent survey conducted by the Community Council to determine whether the evacuees wish to remain in the center, to relocate or to repatriate or expatriate, 2229 persons out of 3000 questionnaires answered stated they wish to remain in the center. 697 intends to relo-

cate and 74 were undecided.

Seventy percent answered the relocation question with 430 for and 1696 against relocation this year. 1263 persons said that \$100 was not enough assistance for relocation while 328 said yes. Approximately 54 persons replied. Of the 35.9 percent responding, 868 said they wish an assistance of \$1000 while 163 said \$500.

Seventy-three percent answered the repatriation and expatriation question. 216 were for and 1986 against, but the opinion on this question has changed considerably within the last few months.

The new regulation which becomes effective May 1, sets forth that it shall be unlawful for any person to breed, keep or maintain live rabbits or poultry within a distance of 100 feet of any building occupied by human being.

TWENTY FARMS INVOLVED IN PROPERTY SUITS

San Diego,--Preparation of escheatment proceedings against Japanese-owned properties in San Diego County was under way last week after conferences between Dist. Atty. Thomas Whelan and Everett Mattoon, Deputy State Attorney General, according to the Los Angeles Times.

When filed in Superior Court, the proceedings will allege that the property involved—20 farms valued at almost \$200,000—was acquired fraudulently, in violation of the Alien Land Laws, Whelan said.

If it can be proved that alien Japanese fraudulently placed title of the land in the name of other persons eligible to own property, the land would revert back to the State, he explained.

WHITING WAR PLANT OPENS TO NISEI

Another of the great war plants in the northern Indiana industrial area was opened to nisei without prior Provost Marshal clearance recently when the Federated Metals Division of the American Smelting and Refining Company, 12230 Indianapolis Boulevard, Whiting, Indiana, was approved by the Army.

Henry C. Cullop, superintendent of the plant, and Sam Thomas, president of the C.I.O. union in the plant give strong assurance of a ready welcome for Japanese American and help in arranging housing will be given by the plant management.

Whiting is adjacent to Chicago so that workers in that area will have access to all the facilities of the big city.

The plant manufactures brass ingots primarily for military use. Wage rates are good, starting at 78¢ per hour with considerable overtime at time and one-half. While the base pay is 78¢ per hour, individual workers may be started at higher wage rates, depending upon the exact job that is assigned to them. Chances of advancement are excellent.

Applications for employment in this plant will be handled by the Chicago district office of the War Relocation Authority.
