## NAKASAKI HELD FOR EVADING PHYSICAL

William Harumi Nakasaki of 6-9-D, who was the only person to refuse to appear for his examination in the second pre-induction mass physicals on April 16, was taken to Phoenix early this week by FBI agents, the office of Internal Security reports.

## FORMER RESIDENT TO GET GUGGENHEIM FELLOWSHIP

Dr. William N. Takahashi, formerly plant pathology instructor at U.C., and now on leave to Cornell University will receive a Guggenheim Fellowship, according to an announcement issued by the Guggenheim Foundation, states the Pacific Citizen.

Dr. Takahashi who was formerly with the Poston Agricultural Dept. as a research man prior to his instructorship to Cornell, will receive his fellowship for work in the biological sciences.

He is the second Nisei to be given such a fellowship, the first going to Isamu Noguchi, a noted sculptor and another former Poston resident.

## ANTI-LAND PETITION OUT

Eugene W. Biscailuz, sheriff of Los Angeles county was the first California voter to sign a petition to permanently bar Japanese aliens from owning or acquiring land in California, states the L.A. Times.

## GAS TO BE RATIONED HERE

Gas will be rationed here starting May 1 to insure compliance with the request of the President that all government agencies cut down on the use of gas, according to Leslie Miller, Motor Pool Supervisor, Unit I.

Gas ration tickets have been issued, each ticket being good for five gallons of gasoline when signed by the

driver and filled in with the property number of the car or truck. Gas station attendants have been instructed to take a ticket for each five gallons of gasoline they issue, and to have the driver of the car or truck sign both the ration tickets and the daily gas sheet. No tickets will be required for tractors or stationary engines.

Mr. Miller says that this is an effort to save tires.

## CIVIL SERVICE EXAMS WILL BE HELD ON MAY 6

Next examination for U.S. Civil Service positions for stenographers, typists and clerks has been scheduled for Sat., May 6, at 1:30 p.m. at Adobe 24 in Camp I according to Edward Nossoff, Acting Relocation Officer and Member-in-Charge, Board of U.S. Civil Service Examiners.

Individuals above 16 years, regardless of whether they are on the stop-list or not, are eligible to take the examination.

To qualify, applicants must be able to type at least 35 words a minute and take

shorthand at 80 words a minute, and are required to furnish their own typewriters, pens and pencils. If they are unable to furnish typewriters for the examination, they should notify the Relocation Office by Friday, May 5.

Applications must be received by the Relocation Office by Fri., May 5.

## NAKAJIMA LEAVES FOR NEW YORK CITY

Leaving Tuesday night for New York on the invitation of Mrs. Mary Hayes, New York relocation officer, is Ichiro Nakajima relocation co-ordination assistant.

Nakajima has recently been in charge of personnel, information and procurement and "has done as much as any one individual to build up the efficiency of the relocation division," according to Edward Nossoff, acting relocation program officer.

Japanese Exclusion Association is the sponsor of the petition and is endorsed by the Native Sons of the Golden West.

The proposed amendment is to "close loopholes in the present alien land law, which permits Japanese aliens to own or acquire land through subterfuge and collusion".

On seasonal leaves: Under the new regulations (handbook Release 60.3.1) private contracts are eliminated and all future contracts for seasonal evacuee workers must be made with the War Food Administration or other government agency handling farm labor procurement. Evacuees seeking evacuee farm labor will make requests through the Federal agency concerned which in turn will contract with evacuees for work on the farm.

### TWO CASES TRIED

Two cases, previously arraigned before the inter-unit Judicial Commission, were tried by the Commission Wednesday morning, April 26. Defendants in both cases waived jury trials which they had requested.
