Male residents who are inducted and placed on Enlisted Reserve will not be eligible for leave assistance grants unless they are involved in a family relocation plan.

Visiting servicemen will no longer be charged for subsistence.

BLOCK RESIDENTS VOTE FOR COUNCIL PROPOSAL ON SHIBAI: \$500 LOAN TO BE MADE

At the weekly Community Council meeting held Wednesday, May 3, with Dr. T. Namiki presiding, the result of votes taken for the method of financing the shibai was announced.

Ten blocks approved the council's proposal, four blocks approved the shibai's proposal, and two blocks rejected both.

The council proposal is to loan \$500 to the shibai fund from Unit III trust fund for use by Engeibu in form of revolving fund. The Engeibu will have access to this fund for their monthly running expenses which are not to exceed \$100 in any given month. This loan is to be repaid by selling tickets or charging admissions. The charges will be set at a nominal figure that would adequately cover the running expenses of the Engeibu.

The proposal presented by the shibai committee was the request of \$1000 allocation from trust fund for one year period with the shibai group to help raise the money in event that the Trust Fund needs it.

Since it was the understanding of both the council and shibai committee that the decision made by the blocks will be final, the shibai department expenses will be met according to the council's proposal.
