WRA TO REOPEN LEUPP CENTER

Plans of the War Relocation Authority to reopen the Leupp Center near Winslow, Arizona about May 15 were announced today by Secretary of the Interior Harold L. Ickes.

The Leupp Center is being reopened to take care of those evacuees of Japanese ancestry who have been agitators or troublemakers at the Tule Lake Segregation Center in northern California. It will be operated under administration of Tule Lake Project Director Ray R. Best.

Approximately 100 men, the majority of them American citizens, who were arrested after taking part in a disturbance at the Ble Lake Center last November 4, will be sent to Leupp. Since the November, disturbance the November, disturbance they have pecalicantian a stockade in the Tule Lake center.
