NISEI MAY MAKE APPLICATION FOR RE-ESTABLISHMENT LOANS

Ex-Policeman Violates Leave Regulation

Pleading guilty to the charge of violating a WRA leave regulation, Yukinobu Tao, former policeman, was sentenced to three months in Yuma County Jail at a special hearing last Saturday morning.

Previously charged with disturbing the peace, Tao was found to be in Gila River relocation center without proper leave papers, and was brought back to Poston for arraignment and trial.

Sitting as judges in the case were Duncan Mills, project director; Morris Burge, deputy project director; Scott Rowley, project attorney, and Charles A. Harper, internal security officer. Also present at the trial were Dick Nishimoto, police commissioner; Elmer Yamamoto, acting city attorney who interpreted, and James Yahiro, city clerk, who acted as advisor to the defendant.

In passing the sentence, Mr. Mills said, "The leave regulations of the WRA have been evolved after much labor and much thought" (cont. on page 2)

CORRECTION

All citizens, including Japanese-Americans, may make applications for loans from the Reconstruction Finance Corporation to establish or re-establish small businesses.

The RFC will accept applications from any small business enterprise, whether it is a corporation, partnership or individual. Included in this category are retail stores, dry cleaning plants, garages and the like. Newspapers, liquor, manufacturing or dispensing establishments are not eligible, however.

THOUSANDS JAM EXHIBIT

Over 11,000 persons jammed the Unit I Auditorium last Saturday and Sunday to see the two-day handicraft exhibit sponsored by the Community Activities, according to Sekizo Yoshikawa of the C.A.

Saturday's attendance from Unit I was estimated to be 4,000 while 6,000 attended Sunday. One thousand from Units II and III attended during the two days.

On exhibit were various articles made by Adult Education classes, many of which were made by discarded articles. Of special interest were a toy train made by the Toy and Model Dept. and a wedding gown by the Blk. 21 sewing school. The C.A. wishes to express appreciation to all exhibitors and persons who contributed to the exhibit.

Security will be arranged with each accepted applicant. Loans will mature in five years and will be amortized on a monthly basis. No loans will be made for the purchase of farm real estate.

Applications can be made direct to any RFC representative or bank, as the RFC is authorized to make loans to any business in co-operation with local banks. Relocated evacuees should contact their district relocation officer first, since he will be able to call on the RFC agency representative in his area and provide him with a rather complete background of the WRA's relocation policy before specific requests are acted upon.

FOOD COMMITTEE ESTABLISHED

For the purpose of bringing about closer co-operation between the subsistence and agricultural departments of the three units, an Agriculture and Food Co-ordinating Committee has been established by the Community Council.

Chairman of the new committee is K. Otsuka, vice chairman, K. Yoshimune and secretary, S. Sugimura.

Members are K. Otsuka, T. Matsumoto, S. Kobayashi and H. Kadowaki, I; J. Terakawa, J. Hayashida, II; and K. Yoshimune and K. Mimura, III.

GOLD PINS AWARDED TEACHERS

Over 100 gold pins were given to the teachers of pre-school through to high school and school officials by the P.T.A., last Wednesday night, May 17, at the school auditorium.

The gold pins, symbolizing Poston with a desert scene with cactus and setting sun in the background with a letter "P", were given to the teachers and officials in recognition of their work on the project and to identify them as members of the Poston school faculty.

John Girdler, high school principal, who was introduced for the first time since his arrival in the center, was one of the main speakers of the eve-

ning. Other speakers were Miss Retha Breeze, elementary school principal and A.L. Harris, director of education.

The latter part of the evening was devoted to entertainment with refreshments being served.

NO MORE RUSH ORDERS FOR PRINTING

Rush orders in job printing, such as tickets, dance programs, wedding announcements, etc., will no longer be accepted by the Poston Print Shop, according to Pauline Bates Brown reports officer.

At least four days must be allowed by the time the order is given and the time the finished work can be had, Mrs. Brown stated.

for the protection of national security, on one hand, and on the other, for those evacuees who can meet the criteria established for leave clearance. The regulations are not perfect. The people who administer them are fallible. Some injustices may occur. The same statement may be made of any law and of any court. It does not excuse any individual for flouting openly the regulations. In this case I believe that this offense is one of the most serious which could be committed against the regulation and against the evacuees as a whole, whether inside the center or relocated outside the center. I cannot condone such an offense, least of all on the part of one who has occupied a responsible position in the center and who knows very well the seriousness of it." Tao was remanded to the custody of Mrs. Harper.
