### New Inter-Camp Bus Time Effective Today

### DELINQUENTS PICKED UP

For failure to appear for induction, Charles Ichiro Oki and George Washington Inouye were taken to Phoenix by FBI agents on Saturday morning, as were Itaro Nishi, Hisashi Ogata and Arthur Asa Shimizu, who refused to appear for pre-induction exams.

A sixth resident, Thomas K. Mizuno, was also taken into custody on a charge of sending a threatening letter.

William Harumi Nakasaki, who previously failed to report for his pre-induction physical, pleaded guilty on May 27 to the violation of the selective service act, and was sentenced to three years in the federal penitentiary.

Six brand new Privates, the first group of inductees to leave Poston, left Tuesday morning at 2 o'clock to begin their life as soldiers in the United States Army. Their destination was the Ft. Douglas, Utah, reception center, from where they will be assigned to an army camp which as yet is unspecified.

### SENTRY SHOOTS TULE RESIDENT

Shoichi James Okamoto, 30, former resident of Garden Grove and Heart Mountain center, was shot by a sentry at Tule Lake center Wednesday afternoon, May 24, according to a wire received by Project Director Duncan Mills from National Director Dillon S. Myer. Mr. Okamoto died in the base hospital at 12:10 a.m. Thursday.

The Japanese American was driving a truck returning from the farm to the center and was stopped by the sentry outside the gate. As he approached the gate, the wire stated, the sentry first struck him with the butt of the gun, then shot him at close range. The reason for the shooting was not clear.

Army authorities at the center arrested the sentry and an investigation was held. The coroner's investigation Friday returned a verdict clearing the sentry of all charges in the slaying.

No sign of disturbance in the center was observed.

The six, whose names follow, are from an original list of 11 called for active duty from Poston, the others being out on leaves: Pvt. Norman S. Okamoto, 222-6-D; Pvt. Sumio Nishi, 219-8-A; Pvt. Hideo Shigekawa, 21-11-C; Pvt. Shiyoichi Matsubara, 19-1-A; Pvt. Tom Aochi, 4-11-A, and Pvt. Takao Eno, 42-5-A.

It is presumed that the other five have reported to Fort Douglas from their present places of residence.

(Sgt. Roy Takai, the nisei "Pvt. Hargrove" writes again from somewhere in India with the British troops:)

"Although the skies are gray, the weather gloomy, wet, and hot, I feel today as I used to feel during the bright spring mornings back home. For this morning (April 30th) I was deluged with 20 some-odd letters. There is nothing like letters to cure a good case of the blues.

"Yes, battle conditions and atmosphere are now a reality. As I sit in our basha-office typing this out, can hear the whine of the projectiles as they pass overhead. At night while attempting to fall asleep we can hear our and their machine guns, mortars, and rifles firing away at each other. Yes, the enemy is that close and one can almost say that they are parked on our front and back steps.

"Air activities have certainly increased lately. The angle worms who inhabit our trenches are beginning to wonder if we are going to move in with them; for we are compelled to jump in and out of them at least four to five times a day. Yes, the worms and I are becoming quite attached to each other.

".....but unpleasant also is the factor of trying to keep clean and healthy. Honestly I haven't had a good wash in weeks. A bath is unheard of in these parts. Also unheard of is the problem of diet in our meals. It is almost as constant as the "pi" in the math circles. Bully beef for breakfast, lunch, and also for dinner.
