in a joint statement PROSPECTIVE INDUCTEES MAY BE REINSTATED

Those on indefinite leave who wish to return to the project because of impending induction into the Army, may do so by presenting their certificate of fitness to the relocation officer in their area, James D. Crawford, relocation program officer, reports.

Men who return without the approval of the relocation officer should present their certificate of fitness to the Project Director.

Such persons will be reinstated as residents and will not be required to pay for subsistence. However, those wishing to remain on visitors' status will be allowed to do so, and will be charged the regular subsistence rate of 60¢ per day.

issued by the Secretary of War, Attorney General, Secretary of the Navy, and the Chairman of the Maritime Commission, the question of alien employment on aeronautical and classified contracts has been clarified.

Contractors and subcontractors for the War and Navy Departments and the Maritime Commission may employ aliens freely as American citizens, except in two cases:

(1) In aeronautical contracts, written consent is required before an alien employee may be permitted to have access to the plans or specifications of the work under construction or to participate in the contract trials under contracts involving aircraft, aircraft parts, or aeronautical accessories for the United States.

(2) In classified contracts, written con-

Cont. from Page 1: sent is required before aliens employed by a contractor in the performance of secret, confidential, or restricted Government contracts shall be permitted to have access to the plans or specifications of the work under such contracts, or to participate in the contract trials.

Also included in the joint statement is the fact that since June 25, 1941, Executive Order No. 8802, otherwise known as the "non-discrimination" clause, has been included in all War and Navy Department and Maritime Commission contracts. This clause requires the granting of full employment opportunities to all loyal and qualified workers regardless of race, creed, color or national origin and applies equally to citizens and non-citizens.

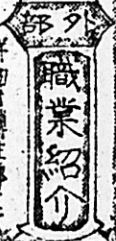
