

MORE CALLED FOR ACTIVE DUTY

Four Tried for Unauthorized Use of WRA Truck

Charged with the use of a government owned Chevrolet truck after working hours, without a permit from the authorities, Henry Yoshida, Roy Hosaka, Richard Takashima and Tautomu Shimizu, all of Camp III, were brought before the project director last Tuesday morning, to be tried for unauthorized use of government property.

Elmer Yamamoto, acting city attorney was called in as interpreter for the benefit of Yoshida and Shimizu while the charges were put before the four defendants of the case. Hosaka, Shimizu and Takashima pleaded innocent of the charges, and the case against them were dismissed. Yoshida, alone, pleaded guilty of all charges brought against him. He admitted that he was responsible.

Before the sentence was determined however, Yoshida asked that he might be allowed to make a confidential statement concerning his reason for keeping the truck out late is (cont'd. on page 4)

At the local community council meeting held on June 5, a report was given by J. Terakawa, stating that the Manpower Committee concerns of our caucasians and seven evacuees.
