Commission of Three to Head Enterprises

R. L. Wilmot, who is connected with the U. S. Employment Service of the War Manpower Commission, arrived here Wednesday night from Ogden Utah for the purpose of recruiting processed seasonal workers for northern Utah canneries.

He has recruited for five companies in Weber, Davis and Box Elder Counties, which can and preserve both fruits and vegetables.

At present about 104 have been signed up and are scheduled to leave in the near future. About 70 of these are girls going to the Woods Cross Cannery.

MORNING LEAVES

CEASE DURING HOLIDAY

A slight change in the dates during which departures from the project are to be restricted, has been reported by Takeo Aoki, assistant leave officer.

Morning departures will cease from June 30 to July 10, instead of July 6 as formerly scheduled. Evening departures will cease from June 27 to July 11.

Emergency situations which evacuees may encounter while traveling from a relocation center to a point of relocation can often times be solved quickly with the help of local units of the Travelers Aid Society. This organization maintains service desks in railroad stations and bus terminals in many American cities, which render prompt service to wartime travelers.

Travelers Aid has had many years of experience in meeting travelers' needs for information and service, and offers a wide variety of free assistance, which ranges from finding a lost child to recommending a good movie or church to strangers passing through a city. Evacuees planning to spend a few days in a city can secure from the Travelers Aid desk free information on housing accommodations, points of interest, medical facilities, and recreational resources. Arrangements can also be made to have a representative of Travelers Aid to meet resettlers at transfer points or on arrival in new towns.

Local units are also equipped to handle more serious problems. Special accommodations can be given persons who lose their money or railroad tickets en route. Medical attention can be provided for travelers.

A list of the local Travelers Aid units and complete information on the types of service available can be secured at the office of James D. Crawford, Relocation Program Officer.
