## MORE BOYS TO BE INDUCTED

### Twelve Held for Evading Induction

Twelve nisei ~~held~~ with failure to report for induction here last Sunday were taken before U.S. commissioner at Yuma to face charges Wednesday morning, the Phoenix Gazette reports.

Six of those taken pleaded guilty before U.S. Commissioner C.W. Ingham while six pleaded not guilty with their hearing set for last Thursday morning.

It was not immediately known who pleaded guilty.

Eichi Omori, the 13th Postonian charged with failure to report for induction last Sunday waived hearing in Phoenix when he appeared before U.S. commissioner F.A. Hickernell last Thursday. He was committed to jail in lieu of \$1,000 bond.

### 61 to Take Oath in Phoenix Wednesday

Ed Takahashi, Senior Steward in Unit 3, talked on his vicissitudes outside. He said it is up to the individual, whether he goes out or not. He encourages young people to go to church when outside. Churches are helping out 100% out there, he said.

A former Postonite who is now in Idaho, writes: "I noticed that over 600 evacuee seasonal workers will be in this district soon from the different relocation centers according to a recent item in the Twin Falls (Idaho) paper..."

"Since coming out here, I have become aware of the fact that centers such as Minidoka and those situated inland have a distinct advantage as far as seasonal work is concerned. Take this work for example, if we were from Minidoka, the transportation would have been furnished as all our employer would have had to do would have been to pick up the evacuees at the camp... Young girls going out for domestic work around Jerome and Twin Falls may often see their prospective employers first before accepting employment, and this arrangement will in most cases lead to a more satisfactory placement. Such an arrangement is hardly possible in Poston and Manzanar. Therefore, considering the handicaps I think the Relocation Division in Poston has done quite well."
