1,000 to be Brought to United States

The War Relocation Authority has been instructed to make arrangements to handle the administration of a new camp to be operated at Fort Ontario, N. Y., for about 1,000 Italian refugees who will arrive soon.

This has been the request of President Roosevelt, who notified Ambassador Robert Murphy in Algiers who is making arrangements for transporting the refugees to the United States.

The War Dept. will properly equip Fort Ontario and will also make arrangements for transportation from the port of arrival to the camp. The Bureau of Budget is to finance the project until UNBRA is in position to assume the financial responsibilities involved.

This move to bring refugees here is in accordance with the opinion of the President, that it is important to indicate that this country is ready to share the burden of caring for refugees during the war. They will be returned to their homelands at the end of war.

(Sgt. Roy Takai, Thakunisei "Pvt. Hargrove" writes again from somewhere in India with the British troop on May 26, 1944:)

"As I sit in our spacious (2 tables, 3 chairs) basha-office situated high in the hills among nature's jungle vegetation and look across the span of green at the mist covered peaks of the neighboring tree crested hills, it is, indeed, hard to conceive that we are now battling against the foe so cleverly hidden in those yonder hills. Yet, we know it must be so for the roar of the guns and the repeated, sharp bursts of the machine guns still reverberate among the hills.

"We are now being initiated to that uncomfortable, wet season known as the monsoon. During the monsoon the weather is dull, overcast and at times very depressing. Just imagine listening to the patter of the rain for hours and hours on time, day in day out, for weeks. There is not one stitch of clothing which can be said to be dry. Even those which I wear now are damp. The paper on which I am now typing is damp also, and the typewriter is acting as though it is suffering from wateritis, too.

"Although the monsoon has more or less set in, the enemy has shown no sign of slackening their operations. This means that we may be around these parts for some time, yet. Aside from dreaming of folks back home my dreams seem to concentrate on "good food and entertainment" which can easily be
