## CUSHMAN COMPILES BEHAVIOR ADVICE

The following information was compiled by W. Allen Cushman, Leave Officer, during his recent trip to Cleveland, O., and Detroit, Mich.; it might prove useful to those relocating:

One should go to the relocation office before the middle of the morning; interviewing goes on only from 8-11 each day and one evening a week.

One should be willing to cooperate with the office workers so that the office may give all the help they can. People not willing to sign the day register cannot be helped. Changes of addresses--it is vital to the organized work of a relocation offices that these be told them.

## New Schedule for Movie Set

New schedule for the regular motion pictures for Poston, was announced July 27, by the motion pictures committee of the community council.

Pictures will be shown twice weekly, Monday and Tuesday, in Unit I, once in Unit

II, Wednesday, and once in Unit III, Thursday.

Next week, July 31-August 4, schedule will be; Monday and Tuesday: Central Swimming Pool and Blk. 59, respectively, Unit I; Wednesday, Unit II; Thursday, Unit III. The main picture will be "Spitfire," starring Leslie Howard and David Niven.

One should have some little idea of what type of work would suit one, if possible.

One should not make his departure from any prospective employer by saying, "O.K., I'll be back tomorrow." The employer expects the person, and if he does not show up, he dislikes the whole Japanese set-up, and the interviewer has made it harder for the next person. One should say he will think it over and let him know whether or not he would care to work for him at a later date. One should set the date if possible, so that the employer would not hold the offer open for that person after that date.

One should be prepared to dress as others do on the outside. Five boys in zoot-suits were refused admission until they had dressed themselves inconspicuously. They hurt their own chance of getting a job and discredited all other Japanese in that area.

One should do nothing to cause himself to be looked at by a passer-by. City sentiment for or against the relocation of Japanese in a certain part of the country may depend on a very small incident caused by lack of thought on the part of one individual.

One should not be "fresh" with any person in stores or lunch places.
