## W. ALLEN CUSHMAN RESIGNS

### Pfc. YAMAMOTO KILLED IN ACTION

Pfc. Johnny Yamamoto, brother of a former Unit 1 Chronicle reporter, was killed in action in Italy, according to a wire received from the War Department by the boy's father, Kanzo Yamamoto, 22-1-C.

Johnny, formerly of Oceanside, Calif., came to Poston in 1942 and volunteered for the Army sometime last year from Salt Lake City, Utah, while he was on seasonal leave. He was sent to Camp Shelby, Miss., where he completed overseas training and went across with the now famous 442nd Infantry.

He is survived by his father, Kanzo Yamamoto, a sister, Hisaye, an ace Chronicle reporter for almost two years before she relocated recently to Springfield, Mass., and two brothers, James and Frank.

Johnny is the fourth Postonian to be killed in action in Italy, and will be awarded the Purple Heart.

### MORE CALLED

Four more of Poston's Risei have been called to report for active duty. Two were called to report on the 4th, while the remaining two are to report on the 10th.

The two which were called yesterday were Hiroshi Makazono, 60-7-C; and Joe Shigematsu, 60-11-C. The two who are to report for active duty on the 10th are Sam Nakamura, 39-5-B; and Iwao Yamaguchi, 13-11-B.

### Five Charged with Violating Leave Regulations

Decisions in the cases of the War Relocation Authority against five evacuee residents were read by Project Director Duncan Mills Thursday morning in Mr. Mill's office. The trial involved five charges which resulted from an accident in which a project car was damaged and a bull was injured.

The sentences were: 1. In the case of WRA against Kenneth Yoshioka, Tomio Inai and Tetsuo Sakamoto, all defendants pleaded guilty to the violation of WRA leave regulation. Yoshioka and Sakamoto were sentenced to be ineligible for leave, except for the purpose of relocation or for an emergency to be determined by the Project Director, for a period of six months. Inai was referred to his supervisor for disciplinary action as may seem to him appropriate for leaving his bus unattended.

2. In the charge of WRA vs. Tetsuo Sakamoto for misuse of a government vehicle, the defendant pleaded not guilty, but his defense was inadequate and was found guilty. His driver's license was revoked.

3. WRA against Tomio Inai, K. Yamamoto and Kenneth Yoshioka. Inai and Yamamoto pleaded not guilty and Yoshioka, guilty. Inai's and Yamamoto's guilt were unable to be proved. With the judgment against Yoshioka and the judgment rendered against Sakamoto, both will pay the government for the

## WORKERS URGENTLY NEEDED

# Briefly

(Sgt. Roy Takai, The nisei " Pvt. Hargrove" writes again from Calcutta, India, on July 16, 1944:)

"Honestly, it certainly feels "good" with a capital "C" to be back in civilization once again--I had almost forgotten how a civilized man acted--six months in the jungles sure take things out of one...

"What a glorious feeling that first bath was!! Gosh, I waddled and squirted water about like a little child--you ought to have seen the color of the water after I finished bathing!! It's good to know that I can once again bathe in codles of water instead of that one measly can of rationed water!!

"This city is one of the largest in India. The European section is almost as modern as some cities in the states...the thing that catches one's eye is the tremendous amount of "rickshaws" running about... Just so I can say I rode one I rode about 10 minutes on one--I must confess I prefer the taxis to them--Anything from the 1925 to the 1940 model cars are used here for taxis... Surprising enough there are no tongs here....

"For entertainment there are the cinemas, clubs which might be termed night clubs, and, of course, the American Red Cross Club where I'm sure many happy hours are spent by the G.I.'s!!! There is a surprising number of Chinese here; and I must say, some of the Chinese girls are okay--It's a pity I haven't taken the time to master the Chinese language... I'm sure it would have come in use. Yes, there are British and Ameri-

# Dust Desert

Two Years of it, two years have slipped away yesterday when the first group of tired and soul-hurt evacuees began filing from 307 in the barren barracks to make their homes on August 4. ....How the time flies --and so little accomplished, and yet each day goes so slow.....

Now entering the third year of this camp life, it may be well to reflect back the twenty-four calendar pages flipped, and see our progress or most likely, the other way we have trod and figure out some way to a better living which seems to be--relocation.

Living together in nose bumping closeness with unwanted agitations and little hope for the future, we saw us turn from a hard working and industrious people of California days into lazy and close to hopeless cases...but on the other hand we have made good friends, learned a thing or two and for many it became a stepping stone for a wider traveling and new environment in other parts of the States.

Materially we have seen great improvements. ...among them our adobe school and auditorium, swimming pools, amphitheatre, sport fields.

As we go into the third year, our population has dwindled from 4393 to 3007. It will continue to decrease as the army calls the boys and resettlement takes a toll.

Despite two years away from it, we still cannot help but yearn for good old California...gee, grapes are just ripe now....and oh, how I'd like to feel that ocean breeze!!
