JUNCAN MILLS DISCUSSES FAMILY PLANNING PROGRAM

A family planning service is now being offered to the people of Poston, according to an announcement made by Duncan Mills, project director. The service is aimed at assuring future security when government guidance has been lessened or perhaps ceased. The service is being offered under a program placed in operation by WRA and

other federal agencies. Personal interviews have been held by the Welfare section with families, to obtain information, and to exchange information and ideas. According to Mr. Mills, the talks are intended to supply the people of Poston, as well as the government representatives, with all the facts available regarding the possibilities of the future years.

"The future is on its way to all of us," said Mr. Mills. "Each of us must meet it as he can, but all of us can meet it better if we assist each other now in making our plans and our preparations according to such knowledge as we have."

Accurate information is needed by both government and the people of Poston, if plans made by the government looking toward assurance of security are to suit the needs of the people, said Mr. Mills. He has asked continued community cooperation for the pooling of information, which is important:

SKETCH FOR MONUMENT SUBMITTED

PENICILLIN GUT FOR PATIENTS

Through the painstaking effort of Dr. A. Pressman, penicillin will be had for Johnny Sugita, age 12, 28-10-A, who is critically ill as a result of a ruptured apendicitis and the setting in of blood poisoning.

This vital drug, reserved for the armed forces, was obtained from the Regional Army Hospital on Davis Mt. in Tucson, Ariz., after first contacting the Denver Medical Depot, where Poston's medical supplies are obtained because of WRA's connection to the Army, it was stated.

The penicillin arrived yesterday, but Johnny may not need it because he is getting steadily better. Although it may not be needed at the present, the penicillin will be had here in Poston for other cases where lives will be on a balance between life and death.

(1) to assist the government in giving families help in making their own plans, and (2) to assist the people in making plans to help themselves by giving them knowledge of what the government is prepared to do, or hopes to do, based on their advice regarding their own hopes and desires for the future. The welfare section is getting and giving information now, but half the job is "up to the people themselves," according to Mr. Mills, who continued, "They will have to run their own affairs, in the next few years, without much control or support by the government. The family planning interviews are meant to give the people all the facts that WRA has which can help them in planning for that time." The pooling of information included: whether families or members thereof hope eventually to return to previous

homes or business, and the possibilities of success, so far as known now, of doing so; and whether they hope to seek or have plans to seek fresh fields of endeavor, and the scope of opportunities for doing that.

One interviewer has been assigned to all the families in blocks from one section, because of the similarity of the facts for families from the same section, and the connection of the plans with possibilities of returning to their homes.

Mr. Mills expressed the hope that this organization of the interviewing staff, will be of assistance when the return to California is possible to some families. He also stated he regards the interviews as having utmost importance; he said he is happy that the response and cooperation to the program has been fine in all.

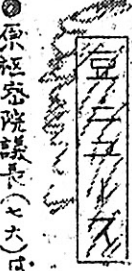
