FORMER POSTON TEACHER KILLED IN ACTION

Pvt. Joe Shiomichi, a former Poston High chemistry teacher, was killed in action in Italy on July 19, while serving with the 442nd Infantry.

Pvt. Shiomichi, formerly of Brawley, Calif., was a graduate of Brawley Union High School, and also attended the University of California for four years, where he was president of the Japanese Students' Club and also a member of the Phi Epsilon Chi Fraternity.

Surviving him is his wife, Miye, who is in Milwaukee, Wis.; his parents, Kesaichi and Fusa Shiomichi, Block 6-5-D; a sister, Mrs. Yoshiki Yoshida, relocated to Michigan; and a brother, Tokio, who is a Pfc. in the army and also serving overseas in the 442nd Infantry.

REFUGEES ARRIVE AT FORT ONTARIO

Nearly a thousand refugees of the European war arrived in Oswego, N.Y. August 5, to remain for the duration of the war in an emergency refugee shelter established by the WRA at Fort Ontario, N.Y., according to an Associated Press dispatch printed in the San Francisco Chronicle.

Chosen on a basis of need from Italian camps, the majority of the 982 men, women, and children, are Poles, Austrians, Yugoslavs, Germans, and Czechs. In all, 19 nationalities are represented.

PLANS FOR AUDITORIUM MADE

Because of the nearness in the completion of the new high school auditorium in Unit III, a meeting was called by Frances Cushman, principal of Parker valley high School, to clear some questions concerning it.

In attendance were seven student representatives, Gerald Umino, from the Administration, and Mas Honda, representing the Community Council and the Community Activities section, and Kyuichi Uyeda from the construction department. Also attending were Miss Barbara Washler and Dick Watanabe, representing the teachers' staff.

It was decided to have a formal dedica-

tion August 21 as the date before any other activity in the auditorium come forth. The committee chosen for the planning of the dedication was Babe Karasawa, student representative, as chairman, and Gerald Umino and Mas Honda as other members.

Whether the YBA should be allowed to hold a movie August 25 in the auditorium, was discussed. It was unanimously decided to permit the YBA to hold its movie. Also brought up was how the uses of the auditorium should be controlled; charge, limit, and so forth were decided. A draft was set up and approved by the members present.

CURRENT CASES OF PROPERTY OFFICE NAMED

"Boy, bring me the asperin," may well be a familiar thing to hear in the evacuee property office here. Cases then being currently handled were named recently by R.W. Schmitt, evacuee property officer, as samples of problems that his office handles continually.

A farm being rented to a produce company, had not been paid for by the tenant. The family wanted this looked into, and they also wanted a check-up made on their furniture. Another family, giving authority to the property office to break into the home, wanted their property removed and had the ranch sold for \$3000. Another family owned a coffee shop for which the people who bought it had not paid, and the bills had accumulated. The property of 25 evacuee was burned in a fire, and their property was being looked into and insurance adjusted. A restaurant having burned up in a fire was a problem of another evacuee. In a church in which personal property was stored, there was a small fire. Desire to sell 186 acres of land and that 160 acres be taken care of, and that a tenant be found for the latter, was being looked into.

New insurance was being sought by one person, who also wanted to sell 80 acres; he also wanted a check made on a house on which he never collected rent. Another man who wanted his property sent to Utah, was having trouble getting it released from the present custodian.

An evacuee had some personal problem he wanted taken care of. Among other problems, were property problems of: typewriters, a contraband camera, a lost refrigerator, a lost piano, which was found, rented farm machinery which was not being used properly. Property stored in churches in three cases was being looked into; problem in regards to a house was being handled. Non-payment of taxes was another problem.

These problems were named by Mr. Schmitt as problems then currently being handled by his office. Not only problems, but money is handled by this office.

They are willing to continue on an eight hour basis, in spite of the headaches. But you are advised: "Don't forget the asperin!"

BOY KILLED IN TULE LAKE ACCIDENT

Teletype dated August 9, received by Duncan Mills, project director, from R. R. Best, project director of the Tule Lake Center, stated Osamu Nakata, 4, son of Mr. and Mrs. Shigeo Nakata, formerly of Fresno, Calif., and Jerome, was killed August 7 at the Tule Lake Center, when struck by a dump truck loaded with coal. The evacuee driver of the truck was cleared of all blame by E.R. Server, Modoc County coroner, who investigated the accident. Although there were no witnesses, it was believed the boy was running alongside the truck when the vehicle started to turn and struck him with the right rear wheel. The truck was preparing to stop at a block to unload and was moving at only about five miles an hour in second gear.
