CARE OF SCHOOL CHILD OUTLINED

Procedure which should be followed for a child who has recovered from an illness of three days or more, was told by the hospital.

Any school child who has recovered from an illness of three days or more, should be brought by the parent, to the child's teacher.

The teacher will look him over. If she feels the child is all right she will re-admit him to the school.

If, however, the teacher wishes advice from the doctor on any point, she will give the parent a slip requesting a check-up in the clinic. After the doctor has checked the child, the parent should follow the doctor's advice. The slip containing the doctor's advice should be returned to the teacher so that she may know what the doctor wishes to have done.

It is hoped that by the above procedure children will be returned to school promptly without undo loss of time.

POSTON BOY IS PROMOTED

Somewhere in Italy a former Poston boy has won his first stripe the hard way--and none can say that winning a promotion on the field of battle isn't doing it just that way.

In a letter dated August 16, Louis Hirata, 13 year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Susuke G. Hirata, Block 10, C. 3, says "Recently I was promoted to private first class (Pfc) much to my surprise." A previous letter, dated July 29, said he was then behind the lines resting after a month's combat duty.

Louie, as Poston friends know him, is a former resident of Los Angeles, attended Abraham Lincoln High School and was graduated from Poston I High School in February, 1943. He entered the army in October 1943, training at Camp Shelby. He visited in Poston on furlough, in March, shortly before going overseas.

Louie's brother, Sgt. Manuel Hirata, is one of the few, if not the only boy of Japanese
