CANTEENS TO BE CLOSED, REPORT 21 GET ACTIVE DUTY CALL— WILL LEAVE THIS FRIDAY

With the exception of one grocery and a dry goods store in each of the units, all canteens are to be closed as a result of the manpower shortage. This decision was reached by the C.E. Board of Trustees in a meeting held last Tuesday, according to George Salomoto of the operations committee.

The exact date of termination will be determined by a special committee which has been selected from among members of the Board of Trustees. They will also designate the stores which will be closed, and make a report on those which will be allowed to remain open for business.

INOCULATION OF DOGS THIS WEEK

In order to prevent rabies, all dogs are to be inoculated this week according to the following schedule:

Unit I, Wed., Sept. 13, 1:00 p.m., at the school assembly hall.

Unit II, Thurs., Sept. 14, 1:00 p.m., at the police station.

Unit III, Fri., Sept. 15, 1:00 p.m., at Poston Square Garden.

There will be no charge for the serum, Miss Elma Rood of public health reports.

Owners are asked to bring their pets on short leash. After inoculation, each will receive an official certificate of inoculation bearing the dog's tag number.

Dogs having no tag and no certificate of inoculation are to be turned over to the dog-catcher.

Twenty-one more youths have been called for active duty and will leave the center Friday, September 15, for Ft. Douglas, Utah. Meanwhile, yesterday morning, 25 were scheduled to report to Phoenix for their pre-induction physical examinations and were to have returned this morning.

Induction is also scheduled for the latter part of this month, and names on this list will be published as soon as they are released by James D. Crawford, relocation program officer.

All packages should be very carefully wrapped and tied, as they sometimes break apart enroute and are consequently stalled at Army post offices, or never reach their destination.

Fortunate were the four girls who were able to have the first privilege of returning to the state we love despite its discriminations and ignorant politicians -- California--without an emergency case... They attended the Annual Christian Conference held in the high mountains of San Bernardino, Calif.

Interviewing one of the representatives from Poston III, Hisaye Watari, she related the following account of her trip to dear ole' California... The pictures they took at Camp Radford are displayed at the Christian church office for everyone to see.

Leaving here on August 26, four in all (another representative from Unit III was Mrs. Tei Trokey), they reached the huge San Bernardino station the following morning.... after being derailed at Cadiz for 6 hrs. The click of their heels against the side walls in front of stores with Caucasians moving back and forth beside them, cars swishing through in the streets was an refreshing experience.

The following are some of the major reasons against the combining of Mess Halls:

1. Economically--Kitchen equipment, utensils, coolers, pipes and other major equipment will deteriorate greatly when not in use. Much of the kitchen equipment, utensils, coolers, pipes and other equipment were purchased by the block residents.

2. Block harmony will be broken because going to eat in another block would mean breaking up of a family unit. Residents of one particular block are like one big family.

3. On adverse condition, great hardship will be felt especially by a family having a sick person or young children.

4. Manpower--Type of workers in mess halls are not adaptable for other type of work. As survey will show.

As all the blocks opposed, it was suggested that Manpower Commission and the Executive Board look into this vital matter.

This newly formed Committee of Manpower Commission and Executive Board is to make the recommendation to the Over-All Manpower Commission in Unit I.

Nakama by winning three middle distance events, the 400 meter free style; 800 meter free style, and the 1500 meter free style, was far out in the lead as the individual star of the meet. He represented his college, Ohio State University. In two of his events, the 1500 and 400 meter races, he set A.A.U. records, leading his nearest competitor in the 1500 meter event by 18 seconds at the finish line.
