## INTAKE SETS RECORD FOR REGISTRATION

Within two hours after arriving Tuesday, the 353 evacuees from Clovis, Calif. were enlisted and registered, setting record time for the well-organized personnel of the Intake and Registration and Housing staffs. Four Santa Fe and Greyhound buses brought the first group into Camp 2 Center at 1:05 p.m. and took only one extra trip to Parker for the remaining. It was also of note that there was 100% enlistment in the Voluntary Work Corps. "It was the smoothest intake we've ever had --and with very few casualties", commented Norris James, Intake Officer. Yesterday's arrivals included 59 from Needles, California, Yermo, and portion of San Bernardino County. This was the final evacuation from Southern California.

Mrs. Kyoko Imamura and Miss Grace Onoye, secretaries of Work Corps in Camp 1 and 2 respectively, headed the staff of forty office workers of typists, fingerprinters, registrars, and interpreters from both camps. Sumio Nishi guided the new personnel of ushers from Camp 2.

Six were treated for light cases of heat prostration at the Emergency First Aid station under the care of Dr. Leo Schnur, Director of Health and Sanitation. A staff of six women as practical nurses and three men for first aiders were on hand headed by Harry Shimachi.

Intakes will continue daily through Saturday.

## POSTON BEACH PREDICTED

Poston Beach, one-half mile north of Camp 2, is predicted by the swimming committee of the Rec. Dept. headed by Charles Nakamura. The channel is to be 10 to 50 ft. in width and 4-8 ft. in depth with plenty of space to accommodate 300 people without crowding. Bacteriology study will be made to ascertain the purity of the water. A diving board and a small 8 ft. wharf have been made by the U.S. Signal Corps, who are now temporarily occupying the place.
