Moris Burge to Leave for Fort Ontario, N. Y.

Deputy Director to Join WRA Refugee Center Staff

Moris Burge, deputy project director, will leave about October 20 to accept the position of assistant project director at Ft. Ontario, Oswego, N.Y., the center established last August the WRA as an emergency shelter for European war refugees.

Mr. Burge arrived here in June, 1942, leaving the executive directorship of the American Association of Indian Affairs. With the opening of Unit III in August, 1942, he was administrator there until his transfer to Unit I in January, 1944 as deputy project director.

English-born, Mr. Burge has studied in England, France and the United States, and has a knowledge of several European languages.

ORDNANCE DEPT. HIRING POLICIES ARE OUPINED

Policies outlined by the RA and the Army Ordnance Department have been set out in a memo to assist in recruiting evacuees from the centers and the field to work at specified ordnance depots.

(1) Family men are wanted. It is intended that no member of the immediate family of the individual remain at the center, whether the employee is at the center, on seasonal or indefinite leave.

(2) Certain centers have been allocated to certain depots to avoid competition and uncertainty.

(3) FMGO clearance is required by employees FMGO Form 58 should be filled out by citizens, FMGO Form 58 by aliens, and question No. 26 of the latter should not be answered, but should be checked.

(4) For honorably discharged veterans and members of the enlisted reserve corps, (1) and (2) should be waived, and the C.O. at the depot will decide whether FMGO clearance is necessary.

The first committee is a special group appointed to compile a report on the activities of the executive board during the past year. This study of the board will determine the need for any alterations in its duties and functions and will be brought before the council at the next meeting.

PFC. THOMAS HIGA SPEAKS BEFORE 2,000 PEOPLE ON JAPANESE AMERICAN BOYS SERVING IN ARMY

About two thousand Unit I residents gathered to hear Pfc. Thomas Higa, veteran of the Italian campaign, speak at Block 4 stage Thursday night. Pfc. Higa said he was born in Hawaii in 1916 and spent 20 years in Japan (Okinawa, Osaka and Tokyo) before returning to Hawaii in 1937.

In 1941, a few months before the Pearl Harbor attack, he was drafted to serve with the 100th Battalion. All members of the 100th are draftees, he said.

In June, 1942, the 100th arrived in Oakland, Calif., and trained at Ft. McCoy, Wis. before transferring to Camp Shelby, Miss.
