## Curtiss Candy Company in Chicago Seeks More Evacuee Workers

### List of Soldiers with Families Here Now Totals 760

Already Employing 100,  
Both Issei and Nisei

Because evacuee workers at the Curtiss Candy Company in Chicago, Ill., numbering about 100 and including both Issei and Nisei, have proved an asset to the plant, more are being sought for work there.

Realizing that housing difficulties confront evacuees entering a city such as Chicago, arrangements for housing and boarding men, couples or girls, have been made. The company is also able to offer part time work for girls and boys who wish to go to school.

## Health Committee Meets to Discuss Hospital Trust Fund

Community May Be Asked  
for \$2,000 Contribution

Methods of soliciting and distributing the Hospital Trust Fund to the hospital staff were discussed in the October 4 meeting of the Public Health Committee.

The estimated sum of \$4,800 was agreed upon to be divided among the physicians, dentists, technicians and other hospital employees, with \$800 to be retained for general expenses.

This means of appreciation will be presented to the medical personnel in June and December, beginning next year. The amount to be distributed this year will cover only the last six months.

The following tentative arrangement is to be submitted to the unit councils and block managers group for consultation and suggestions:

Twelve physicians, dentists and optometrists--\$1,800 annually.
