One More Reported Missing, Five More Wounded

Memorial services for Pfc. Paul Fumio Horiuchi, killed Oct. 18 in France while fighting with the 42nd, will be held at Unit I elementary school hall at 7 p.m. tomorrow.

Shozo Sasuga, Block 2 manager, will be the chairman. Incense will be offered by family and relatives. Memorial addresses will be given by representatives of various organizations. Rev. Ryuei Masuoka will deliver the sermon. Words of appreciation in behalf of the family will be given by Juryo Umori.

Taps will be sounded by men from Service Command #1995.

ELEVEN MEN REFUSE INDUCTION AT PHOENIX

Ten men from Poston appeared in Phoenix before F.A. Hickernell, U.S. Commissioner, on Oct. 31, on charges of refusing to submit to induction, according to the Phoenix Gazette on Nov. 1. Another was brought before the commissioner on Nov. 1 on the same charge.

All were released under \$1,000 bond to await action of the federal grand jury.

T/Sgt. Abraham Ohama, whose family lives in II, has been reported killed in French action, bringing the number of gold stars on Poston's service flag to eight.

Five more men, Pfc. Sho Katayama, S/Sgt. Frank Wada, Pfc. Harry Kowase, Sgt. Fred Sakasegawa and Pvt. Sakaichi Soda, have been reported wounded, making a total of 35 center soldiers who have been injured.

Pfc. Jou Okitsu, previously wounded, has been reported missing in action in France.

T/Sgt. Abraham G. Ohama, 28, was killed in action in France on Oct. 20, according to a War Department message received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Kunzo Ohama, 222 9-C.

T/Sgt. Ohama was inducted from Sanger, Calif., in February, 1940. Previously, he was employed at the Guadeloupe Produce Co., after graduation from Sanger Union high school in 1934. In school, he was active in many sports and was also on the scholarship (cont. on Unit I page)

He is survived by his parents, three brothers, Willie, Ben, and George, and a married sister in Idaho. His brother Ben has been called for duty.

Reported missing in action in France since Oct. 19, is Pfc. Jou Okitsu, 25, son of Eikiichi Okitsu, 54-1-C, who previously received the Purple Heart for wounds received in action in Italy.

In a recent War department release, he was also reported as having braved enemy fire to rescue some of his wounded 442nd comrades on the Fifth Army Front in Italy.

Pfc. Okitsu was called for duty before Pearl Harbor, but was placed on reserve after the outbreak of the war. His second call came in August, 1943, and he was assigned to Camp Shelby.

Los Angeles - born, the missing soldier lived in Brawley before evacuation. He graduated Brawley Union high school in 1937 and Brawley Junior college in 1939.

Before evacuation, he was engaged in farm work, and was employed as a surveyor here. His father and sister, Suji, still live in the center. His mother passed away earlier this year, before he went overseas.

Mr. and Mrs. Tomoji Katayama, 305-4-A, have been informed that their eldest son, Pfc. Sho Katayama, was slightly wounded in action on the French front, Oct. 20.

The official wire was addressed to Mrs. Midori D. Katayama, the wounded soldier's wife, who has relocated to Milwaukee, Wis.

Pfc. Katayama was drafted in January, 1942 from Orosi, Calif., where he was farming after graduation from

Orosi high school.

He has two brothers and a sister.

S/Sgt. Frank Wada, 23, was reported slightly wounded in action in France on Oct. 18, according to word received by his mother, Mrs. Waki Wada, 30-2-D.

The wire of notification was addressed to Mrs. Jean I. Wada, formerly of 327-1-C, who is now living in Chicago, Ill.

S/Sgt. Wada graduated from high school in Redlands, Calif., and later worked as bookkeeper at a San Diego, (Calif.) vegetable exchange. He volunteered from Poston in May, 1943.

Word has come to the families of Sgt. Fred Sakasegawa, 213-12-A; Pvt. Sakaichi Soda, 213-3-BC, and Pfc. Harry Kowase, 322-14-F, that they have been wounded.

A letter from Sgt. Sakasegawa said that he had been wounded in France on Oct. 20. He is from Salinas and is 24 years old. He was called before evacuation.

Pvt. Soda's letter told his family that he was wounded in Italy, July 6. He is 19, a graduate of Gilroy high school, and volunteered from Poston.

A telegram has come, informing Mr. and Mrs. Gitaro Kowase that their son was wounded in Italy, July 17. He was inducted in San Diego before the war, and is a graduate of Pt. Loma high school.
