COUNCIL ELECTION TUESDAY

Great interest is centered on the coming election for the Temporary Community Council, consisting of one representative from each block. Thirty-one representatives will be selected. Their term will expire when the permanent council is elected. The council will increase as new blocks are settled. An interpreter will be present at each precinct, during the voting hours (7 A.M. to 2 P.M., Tuesday, the 21st). The election board will consist of two people; one member of the Blk. Mgr. staff and one selected by the Blk. council.

Candidates may remain at the election polls or have a representative there.

Anyone 16 years or over, citizens or non-citizens are eligible voters.

Neat, wooden ballot boxes are now completed and sample ballots are being distributed to the Blk. Mgrs. today.

---593 EVACUEES ARRIVED FROM LINDSAY---

593 evacuees from Lindsay, Hanford and Tulare arrived at Camp 2, Intake Center, Friday afternoon, July 17, ending the intake period for the week.

The evacuees arrived at Parker at Parker at 12 P.M., by train, from Central California and were transferred to buses that transported them to Camp 2, where they will be housed. Four round trips were required for the caravan of buses to transport the evacuees to camp. Only a few cases of heat prostration were reported by the Intake Center.

Starting July 23, approximately 750 evacuees are expected to arrive here, from the Pinedale Assembly Center, located in Central California, according to Norris James, Intake Center. It is also reported that construction of Camp 3 will be completed by August 1st and it is expected that all three camps will be filled by August 15th.
