Judicial Commission Stresses

Two residents, Susumu Kawato and Aiji Ochi, pleaded guilty this week to charges of using government property without proper authority and were sentenced to seven days in jail, suspended, and put on 40 days' probation.

In pronouncing the sentence, George Takahara, Judicial Commission chairman, reminded the defendants of the importance of conserving government property. The offense, he said, was one against the community, which might endanger the privileges of all the people. Future offenses of this kind are to be punished by fine and jail sentence or both.
