## GO TO YOUR POLLS AND VOTE

### Final Plans For Election Made

While there was a tremendous amount of last minute activity yesterday in preparing for today's election, with some blocks flaunting campaign signs and campaign managers more loudly proclaiming their candidates' ability, Blk. Mgrs. gathered in a meeting at which Ted Haas, Project Attorney, gave instructions on election procedure and answered questions on the subject:

Ballots, ballot boxes, sealing material, papers for certified lists of results and other necessary equipment were distributed at the polls yesterday.

Voting is on from 7 a.m. to 2 p.m., today, at the Blk. Mgrs.' offices.

Results will be published in the special election edition tomorrow, and the first meeting of the Temporary Council will be held at 7:45 P. M. at Pioneer Grove. They will be sworn in, to promise to perform faithfully duties of its office and to obey the Constitution and Laws of the United States. Open to the public, the meeting will be attended by most of the project officials, with Wade Head, Project Director, and John Evans, Assistant Director, delivering addresses.

A chairman, an executive committee and various sub-committees are to be chosen.

Thursday's Press Bulletin will carry the complete results of today's election.
