THOUSANDS VOTED, ELECTING 31 COUNCILMAN

"Yesterday's election was conducted in a very orderly fashion with a big percentage of voters showing up at the polls where an air of seriousness prevailed as the importance of the Community Council was realized by the young and old", states Theodore Haas, Project Attorney. Campaign ended Monday evening with short speeches, some in Japanese and others in English, by the candidates at most Mess Halls.

Voters came out early, and in one block where the returns were tabulated early, 99% of voters was recorded.

Mary Tachibana of Block 43, was the lone woman to be elected councilman in yesterday's election.

BLK. 6 PARK OFFICIALLY OPENS

The ceremony was started by an introductory speech by "Shig" Imamura, program chrmn. and Mr. Head nailing on the name of the bridge, "Pioneer Bridge", on the railing. Then Mr. Head cut the ribbon, and led the procession to the park, where Mr. Head was handed a piece of board with the name of the park on it, and was surprised to find his name honored. The park, the third of its kind to be established by block residents, is several acres in size.

Refreshments consisting of sandwiches, punch, "onigiris" and popsicles were served to all. Among the other guests present were Mr. John Evans, M. Burges and Mrs. Johnson. The program concluded with entertainment with Shig Imamura acting as master of ceremonies.
