T-Sgt. Abraham Ohama Died When He Tried To Save Wounded Buddy

WITH THE SIXTH ARMY GROUP, FRANCE--Technical Sergeant Abraham G. Ohama, Los Angeles, Calif., a platoon sergeant in a rifle company, Second Battalion, 442nd Japanese American Combat Team, knew that he was going to his death when he tried to save a wounded comrade on a battlefield in France.

As the 36th "Texas" Division spearheaded the Seventh Army's drive through the Vosges Mountains of Northeastern France, Sergeant Ohama's company encountered a strong enemy force on Hill 503, a dominating elevation.

On his own initiative, he reconnoitered the German stronghold. The information he gathered of enemy (an emplacements contributed to the success of the attack on the hill.

When Sgt. Ohama's company stormed the enemy positions, one of his runners was seriously wounded by a

sniper and lay in plain view. Though realizing that he was practically going to his death, but with utter disregard for his personal safety, he moved out to pull the injured soldier back to safety. HOOD RIVER SUN REPORTS
PFC. HACHIYA'S NAME
NEVER ON HONOR ROLL

The Hood River Sun, February 23, printed a full story on Pfc. Frank T. Hachiya, killed on Leyte, stating his name had never been erased from the Hood River Honor Roll "as reported in the Oregonian" because his name had never been on the list, said R.B. Cozzens, assistant director of WRA, in a bulletin, Wednesday, March 7. Hachiya, it seems, had enlisted from Portland.

Mr. Cozzens said reference to him as one of those whose names were stricken from the honor roll, should be avoided.

Pfc. Hachiya was born in Hood River, attended grade school at Odell in the Hood River district, was a freshman and senior at Odell High School, and spent his sophomore and junior years in Japan, where he returned with his mother whose mother was ill in Japan.

He attended Multnomah College a year, and transferred to the University of Oregon, enlisting early in 1942.

His mother is still in Japan; his father at a relocation center.

T/SGT. OHAMA KILLED AS
HE TRIES TO SAVE G. I.

When the news of the manner in which their leader had given his life reached the men of his company, it infuriated and inspired them. They launched an attack that stormed the slopes and overran the top, killing 125 of the enemy and capturing 20.

By the heroism of his sacrifice, and the timeliness of the information he gained on his voluntary reconnaissance, Sgt. Ohama made it possible for his rifle company to capture Hill 503. The action stabilized the entire battalion sector east of Brugere, France.

Before coming to France, he participated in the Italian campaign with the 34th "Red Bull" Division in the Allied push from North of Rome to and across the Arno.

Sgt. Ohama entered service on February 24, 1941, from Los Angeles.

His mother, Mrs. Hana Ohama, lives at 222-9-C.

T/Sgt. Ohama was killed in France October 20, 1944.
