## Sgt. Ogata, Wire Chief, Performs Heroic Acts

SIXTH ARMY GROUP, FRANCE--During the 442nd Regimental Combat Team's advance through the Vosges Mountains of Northeastern France, Sergeant Mikiri Ogata, a wire chief in one of the battalions, and the son of Mrs. Yone Ogata of Blk. 6-10-B, performed acts of heroism on the battlefields.

When a task force composed of two rifle companies was assigned the mission of encircling the left flank of an enemy strongpoint and striking them from the rear, Sgt. Ogata was called upon to lay a communications line between the Battalion Command Post and the forward rifle companies. Although he had had but little rest in the past 24 hours, the sergeant followed the assault platoon over rough and heavily-wooded terrain, laying the wire and keeping pace with the riflemen.

A strong German resistance halted the advance at one point and the Bakersfield sergeant volunteered to go forward to assist the riflemen in neutralizing the enemy positions. While moving forward, he observed an enemy taking aim upon one of his comrades. The Sergeant immediately fired and killed the German.

Before coming to France, Sgt. Ogata fought with his unit in Italy. They made the northward sweep from Suvereto to Pisa and Florence.

Any person who holds an honorable discharge from any branch of the United States armed services will be welcome, Mr. Rowley said, and veterans of World War II are particularly urged to attend. The club membership now includes several evacuee and Caucasian veterans of World War I, a former Army nurse, and a number of World War II veterans.

Contrary to the article printed in a recent issue of the Chronicle, the pre-induction physical examination and inductions procedure did not merge as of March 19, according to the selective service office. It was a case of miscomprehension as the physical and inductions are given in one process to only those who fail to comply with their first official notification.

### RATION COMMITTEE MAKES DISTRIBUTION RULING

In a meeting of the cigarette rationing committee, at the Poston co-op office, attended by persons from Units 1, 2, and 3, methods of controlling the rationing of cigarettes were discussed and a ruling was devised.

It was decided: (1) no new additional ration card will be issued based on the list of the second issue (March 11-17); (2) sale clerks at the canteens are to honor one card from each customer; (3) cards of persons leaving the project indefinitely are to be picked up by the block managers and returned to the co-op; (4) if the card is lost, stolen, or burned, the new card will be issued only after thirty-days with the block managers approval; a visitor smoker must get a slip from the block manager before a visitor's coupon is issued. A blank form will be mimeographed by the co-op and distributed for this purpose to the block managers.

### 100TH BATTALION IS CONTINUING WORK BEGUN IN ITALIAN CAMPAIGN

SIXTH ARMY GROUP, FRANCE--The 100th Battalion of the 442nd Infantry Regiment, is writing another thrilling chapter in its already massive book of courageous actions in a sector of that formidable barrier, the Vosges, 250 miles of jagged mountain ridges and snowcapped peaks that separate Southern France from Italy.

The 100th gained a reputation as "the fightin'est outfit" during one of the most sensational actions of the Italian campaign, when it was ordered to wipe out a strongly defended German bastion, a small town north of Rome. In a short time, it took the town, cut the main German escape highway at three points destroyed the enemy's right flank, and forced a withdrawal over six strategic miles; with Germans killed, wounded and captured totalling over 270. For this and consistently outstanding combat operations, the Battalion was awarded a War Department Distinguished Unit Citation.

In France, the story of the 100th's heroic rescue of the 36th Division's "lost battalion" has been told and re-told. The 100th has been awarded 1,547 Purple Hearts and Oak Leaf Clusters for wounds.

Among those representing the 100th are Sgt. Albert [redacted], 4-5-D, and [redacted] Shiba, 309-9-D.

## MINIDOKA GIRL ONE OF 12 TO RECEIVE BARDWELL AWARD FROM MT. HOLYOKE

Hattie Kawahara, formerly of Minidoka center, was one of the 12 girls to receive the Bardwell Memorial award from Mt. Holyoke College, South Hadley, Mass., one of New England's outstanding liberal arts college.

Miss Kawahara came to Mt. Holyoke College direct from Minidoka over a year ago as a political science graduate assistant. Entering Mt. Holyoke with advanced standing credits, she graduated with honors in her political science course in October, 1943.

Under the Bardwell award she expects to complete her course for doctor of philosophy at either Radcliffe College, Cambridge, Mass., a women's associate college of Harvard University, or at the University of Chicago.

Accompanying the Poston champions to Phoenix will be Martin Morocco, selective service representative in Unit I, who has had experience in officiating basketball and baseball games. Having played on a Cleveland high school team that won the state championship in Ohio, Mr. Morocco is quite familiar with the sport.

Minus the services of their brilliant scoring ace, Norman Kitahara, who relocated Tuesday, the Camp III kings, nevertheless, steamed ahead in the last quarter after a nip-and-tuck battle throughout the first three quarters. Deadlocked four times during the rough and tumble fray, the Blackbirds kept in the game by cirture of charity throws, scoring 10 of their 18 counters on free flips.

The loss of Morinishi in the third quarter who was ejected on fouls, proved to be costly as the 328 boys surged forward after his absence. Yamada, substitute pivot-man, sparked 328's last quarter rally by sinking beautiful pivot-shots from the free throw mark.

The surplus manpower on the 328 roster was another overpowering factor which proved to be an overdose to the Blackbirds who depend

largely on their starting five, having only two subs.

Scoring laurels for the evening were copied by 328's Yamada and Forward Kawashima of the Blackbirds with eight markers each.

「去十五日當市に於て日本人藤井六衛(六一才)松浦金太郎(六五才)兩名が撲殺された者報道された様様である。同時に同じ場所で行行が續せられたかのやうな受取った者もあるらしい。然し事實はさにあらず
