PROCEDURES FOR RETURN OF HAWAIIAMS (Continued from front page)

to Mawaii when permise sion is granted to them, the Ad. Notice said.

There are two groups of people for which arrangements are whally independent.

Persons not evaquated from Hawaii but wha came to the mainland before the outbreak of war (and who may or may mot have been evaquated, will continue to be handled by the Commending General of the Pacific Ocean Areas with travel arranged through the 12th Naval District of San Francisco, on the basis of individual applications. The San Francisco Relocation office will give individual assistance as may be necessary, under the general authority progided in WRA instructions. Travel is controlled on the basis of the Navy priority system, by the 12th Naval District, which individuals advises when to arrive in San Francisco to be included on a particular sailing.

Persons evacuated directly from Hawaii by the Army and placed under WRA jurisdiction, including those paroled from internment camps to relocation centers, will be provided with transportation under a specific arrangement with the Army, coordination of which will be handled through the WRA Washington. From time to time, relocation centers and offices will be notified that certain individuals have been designated for return and will be asked to accept a "ready date," that is, date after which the person can leave on very short notice for a designated port. He should not give up his job or living quarters until he is advised of his "port call date," or date on which he must be at the port. Board and

Persons traveling un-er this dwangement der this will be given #14vitetional travel onders at or about the time they are advised of the port call date. If they leave their point of residence before receiving these orders, they will be unable to sail. Neither the name of the port nor the date to arrive there will be given to the evacuee until the designation of a port

Ocean transportation in the case of persons evacuated from Hawali will be at WRA's expense, with the relocation supervisor at the port issuing a Government Transportation Request for the steamship ticket and making such grant as appropriate to cover cost of meals.

WRA queries concern= ing "ready dates" will ask how much baggage to an average of 175 pounds. However, since an excess by one person can be handled only as a result of a deficiency by someone else, requests for taking an excess of 175 pounds should be made only in cases of urgest necessity. Plans for ship-ping in excess of 175 pounds may be made under the general regulations of WRA concerning shipment of freight.
