Two days before the scheduled closing for Units II and III, the lost family of evacuees in Unit II left the in Unit II left the Santa Fe Station in Parker for the outside after more than three years of center life. Unit III relocated its last family the following night, September 29, leaving both Soptomompty with the exception of personnel and the sixteen fami-lies of Hopi Indians who arrived at Unit II the first of September.

Baggage trucks piled high, deserted mess halls and barracks and lines of waiting evacuees both at the Leave Office in Unit I and in the Parker Roilroad Station were the subjects of some of his pix ures. These photos are to be used as an incentive to more manid relocation in other projects.

Mr. Iwasaki commented upon the co-operation between the appointed staff and the evacuees and said that he felt it was a contributing factor in Poston's high rate of relocation.

In addition to the shots he took of the closing of the camps, Mr. Iwasaki also photographed some of the new Poston residents, the Hopi Indians now living in Block 208.

### PARENTS OF DECEASED SERVICEMEN SHOULD FILE CLAIMS

Evacuee parents of servicemen deceased should file claims for death pensions by addressing a request to the Manager, Veterans Administration, at Tucson, Arizona.

Those parents whose claims were previously rejected, and who are now planning relocation should file reclaims on the basis of change of circumstances.Closing of centers and death pension appli-cants' resettlement in outside communities may be considered a change of circumstances.

In a letter to W.R.A. General Omar M. Bradley, Vaterans Administrator explained that death pension claims which have been denied to center residents up to this time were rejected because evacuees maintained at government expense on relocation projects were not considered dependents within the meaning of the pension law.
