

We hear that the Allies haten't sufficient supplies to support a second front. Then again we hear they have. We also hear that they don't mant to risk a second front at this time in case of possible defeat. That they don't want to take a chance until they are sure and ready.

"But can we afford to wait until we are sure and ready) Can we afford to play safe? There is no safe strategy in war...Note, official Washington and official these are not questions to create dissension. London, We ask then in order to dispel confusion and to engender confidence and unity for eventual victory. And whatever the answer is we can take it."

We, too, can take it-whatever the answer-off the asser will lead to democracy's victory over fascism.
