With 200 evacuee residents housed in the Provolabor camp, the camp director reported that persons had fired shots into the camp. As a result of this, a girl received a scratch from a shot gun pellet, but no medical treatment was required.

Following up this case, it was reported that the incident was largely instigated by transients stopping at Provo, and 5 arrests have been made. The arrested ringleaders are facing federal charges, and Provo




