

LARGE-SCALE PRODUCTION OF TOFU TO START

The mess division promises to satisfy the appetite of the tofu-hungry residents beginning next month when the center tofu factory will swing into full scale operation.

Since last Saturday the tofu plant has only been producing a small supply of tofu which filled the needs of six mess halls at one time under the supervision of T. Nakagawa, states Ted Tanaka, assistant project steward.

Tofu, which is to be produced at the factory located at warehouse number 12, is made from ground soy beans and then prepared with "ni-ga-li." The combined ingredients are placed in trays or boxes to form cubes. Tofu are always kept in water until distribution," E. Amamoto, foreman, revealed.

BULLETINS TO PRESENT TRUE PICTURE BY RELOCATEES

In order to present a clearer picture of relocation problems, the true ups and downs of new and strange life any evacuee must go thru before he is accepted by the community, various WRA regional reports offices will distribute resettlement bulletins, stated Frank Cross, head of WRA Reports Office in Washington, D.C.

Realizing the need for more accuracy in the relocation stories so the prospective relocater may be better prepared to cope with any adverse condition, these issues will contain information gleaned directly from resettled ones.

Cross further disclosed that greater emphasis will be shown towards family relocation, which in turn means making the issue more relocation conscious.

At present Kansas City regional office is the only one issuing bulletins, but others will begin publishing them in the near future for distribution to all relocation centers as well as to various relocaters.

These reports will be edited and published in the

manner typically followed by all center papers, stated Cross, and manned by relocatees of the immediate area on voluntary basis and perhaps part-time.

Girls who took the previous test have been placed in lucrative positions, both with private concerns and government agencies, concluded Vecchio.

I always believed that the American Legion and her national magazine would dare not say or publish anything favorable to the nisei. But in the October issue, the publication printed a letter from one of their readers in reply to an article concerning the Japanese post-war problem, and following are excerpts:

"We are told that all states should deny these exiled citizens the right to settle within their boundaries. Instead it is implied we should take a minority group which has proved itself the most self-sufficient, the least inclined to crime, the most seldom on relief, the group with the most wholesome family life--the most industrious group, and spend \$200,000 a day, more or less to keep them in "protective custody" in concentration camps, while in Hawaii they guard our munition plants and police our streets, work in our defense industries.

"I make no plea for the anti-Americans of any group. My plea is for the loyal American regardless of the color of his skin. I know the nisei because I have lived amongst them for years...I have heard their chokes of emotion and have seen the tears streaming down their faces as they must make--in order that their loyalties to this country may go unchallenged.

"The Legion almost proved itself to be what it has so frequently been called--the "un-American Legion." I want to see the Legion become a builder, not a destroyer of American unity."

One of the queerest sights in the last minute movement of 370 Tuleans on Nov. 10, as the train prepared to pull out for other relocation centers, was an elderly issei clutching a cactus plant wrapped in heavy paper to his chest as he boarded a coach.

Safety First, Amache

ALONG both sides of Amache "broadway" evacuee workers are digging and reinforcing the drainage ditches with customary efficiency. Their value and usefulness unquestioned.

But they also present a nocturnal safety hazard due to lack of lights along the street. These man-made ditches, as well as those dug by nature, make a nice "booby-trap" for the unwary traveler.

LAST Sunday night many residents attended the artificial flower-miniature garden exhibit at the Hospitality House. It was interesting and enjoyable.

But before reaching the building there is a sand bank about 20 feet away, over which people had to go over. Once again the lack of illumination showed up--for not even a small light bulb was placed at the entrance.

SCARCELY the need for proper street lighting system and entrance lights to places where public functions are held cannot be too well stressed. There should be lights to make Amache streets and walks safe--especially for old folks.

Of course, we all appreciate the matter of priority "this and priority "that" but priority on LIFE and PUBLIC SAFETY is also of prime importance. --R.Y.

FUCHIWAKI TO SERVE TERM IN PENITENTIARY FOR \$63 ROBBERY

Ywaji Fuchiwaki of TC-11P, who robbed roommate Yonehachi Yonemura of \$63 while the latter was confined in the hospital with a split head, was sentenced to an indeterminate term of not less than 18 months nor more than 3 years in the state penitentiary at Canon City, Colo. by the district court of Lamar Wednesday stated Toichi Nakamura, police chief.

Fuchiwaki pleaded guilty to the grand larceny charge, and the prosecution recommended a minimum penalty, because of his old age.

Before pronouncing the sentence, the district court's opinion was, "A man at the age of 60 with all experiences of life must not be normal to commit such a crime. This sentence does not affect in anyway race, color or creed."

NISEI HARVEST TULE LAKE PRODUCE AT CURRENT WAGES

HEART MOUNTAIN Wyo., Nov. 17.--Japanese-American workers, recruited from other relocation camps after internment at the Tule Lake, Calif. camp refused to work, are earning over \$70 a week at the Tule Lake farm project.

This was disclosed Tuesday in a report to the WRA camp newspaper at Heart Mountain. The paper said there were 237 volunteer workers from four inland WRA camps at the Tule Lake project and that they were putting in an average of better than ten hours per day harvesting cabbage, carrots, grain and potatoes.

Meanwhile, WRA officials announced the start of a new relocation program designed to speed evacuees to communities and cities throughout the nation, except on the west coast. EVACUEES MUST FIND PLACE IN U.S. LIFE

In a formal statement, WRA officials said:

"Since relocation is the primary objective of the WRA, it is important that we have a common understanding of the basic assumptions on which the relocation policy is based. These are:

"1--Evacuees must ultimately find their place in American society and not in the relocation centers, which are temporary homes.

"2--Resettlement in the near future is desirable for the evacuees and the nation because it is the most effective means of re-establishing civil rights.

"3--Relocation is a vital contribution to the solution of the nation's urgent manpower problem.

"4--Continued life in relocation centers is undermining the independence of

a vigorous and self-reliant people, and this independence can be preserved only thru their efforts to re-establish themselves in the life of American communities.

"5--The assimilation of Americans of Japanese ancestry and the solution of their problems can be aided by the education of the American public thru first-hand contact."

DES MOINES, Ia.—The heartwarming tale of an Iowa family which took a Japanese-American evacuee girl into their home as a foster daughter is revealed in a letter to the Des Moines Sunday Register's recent issue.

The letter was written by Mrs. M. E. Perry of Creston, Iowa and read:

"On Aug. 27 we took a nisei into our home as a foster daughter. She is 14 and a freshman in high school. She is clean, attractive and very intelligent. Many have asked about her English and my answer is that it is perfect. Before her arrival several warned I would have trouble, that people would be unkind. We have had nothing but kindness shown her ever since her arrival.

"She attends Cheston high school, where both the teachers and students are very friendly. She attends the Congregational church and sings in the choir. There, too, everyone is friendly.

"I have three children

of my own and to them she is a big sister. Her quiet and polite manner have done much to help my own children to grow up better. I am sure our home will always be better because we have taken this little nisei girl into our home. I am sure we love her as much as if she were one of our very own."

If you are in doubt—please be assured that Secretary Stimson gave this matter a thorough consideration before giving his consent and approval of the value of the Japanese language.

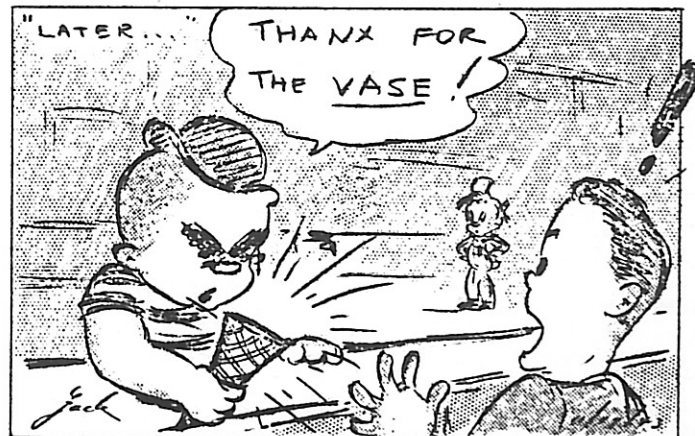
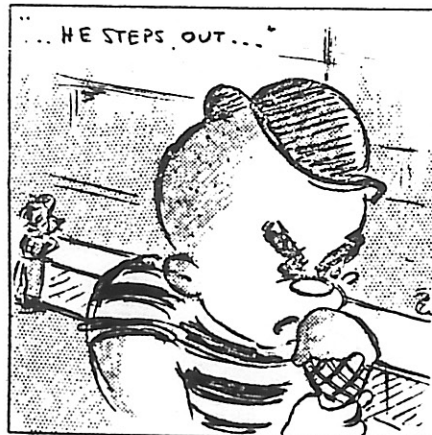
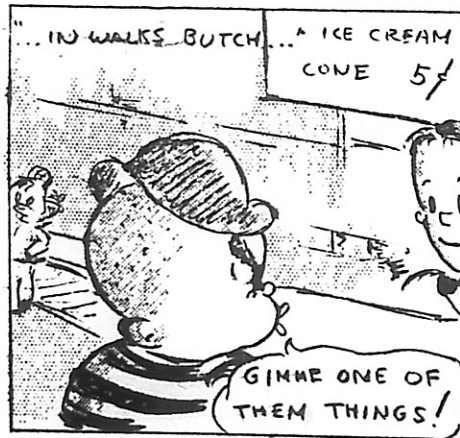
