

NEW ORDER "GROUNDS" SO PROJECT VEHICLES

Orders from Washington WRA office have necessitated the reduction of 50 vehicles from the center transportation system, Clyde Shrader, motor pool supervisor, stated yesterday. Effective Thursday, July 13, the new regulations will cut the present force of 168 vehicles to 118.

The "slashed" vehicles, which include cargoes, stakes, pick-ups and passenger cars, will be transferred to the Treasury Procurement office within next week. Despite the reduction, Shrader added, most of the efficiency will still be maintained.

PVT. SHINAGAWA TO VISIT AMACHE TO RECRUIT WACS

Pvt. Shizuko Shinagawa, vivacious 21-year-old nisei WAC stationed in Denver, Colo., will arrive in Amache on or about July 25 on a WAC recruiting assignment. Lieut. Sarah P. Reid will accompany Private Shinagawa.

She is a native of Phoenix, Ariz., and was inducted into the Women's Army Corps on Aug. 16, 1943. Shizuka received her basic training at Ft. Des Moines, Iowa, and subsequently sent to Denver on her present mission.

Pamphlets and informational materials describing the many advantages offered by the WAC have been distributed to each block information office. Local nisei women interested in WAC enlistment are urged to study the publicity materials.

FULLER SUCCEEDS HARBISON

It was William M. Fuller, who succeeded Donald E. Harbison as assistant project director in charge of operations, and not William M. Ford as it was incorrectly stated in the Wednesday's issue of the PIONEER.

The error was detected by Walter N. Moers, personnel officer, Wednesday afternoon, after the papers were distributed.

MORE EMPHASIS ON PROPER UTILIZATION OF WORKERS

In order to circumvent the ever-increasing acute-ness of center evacuee labor problem, Project Director James G. Lindley will put the brakes on workers free-lancing from job to job and place more emphasis on proper utilization of workers available through his project instruction no. 38 effective July 17. This instruction is called evacuee employment procedure.

According to the new edict, no evacuee shall be assigned, transferred or terminated unless such action is specifically approved in advance by the personnel management section. This section will make the final decision relative to placement and transfer of evacuee workers for the best utilization of labor needs, and every effort will be made to place workers in jobs they are most occupationally qualified.

Evacuees working without first obtaining "Notice of Assignment" from the personnel office will not be paid for services rendered prior to the date of official approval.

Authority to transfer evacuee workers between divisions or sections is vested solely in the personnel management section and only after a check and clearance by the said section with the supervisors involved may transfers be accomplished.

Each section wishing to terminate a worker must submit a "Request for Separation" signed by the section head with complete information regarding reason for termination to the personnel office. In case of dismissal for cause, the supervisor must notify the worker personally and state reason; the worker then has a five-day period in which to appeal to the personnel office.

Tuesday night, several staff members and I weathered the rain storm to attend the movie, "Government Girl," which depicted the daily life in the nation's busy Capitol. The picture was just another wartime production, but I couldn't forget the emphasis placed on women and girls doing the work normally done by men during peacetime. This is no revelation for the radio, press and magazines have continually publicized that fact hundreds of times.

But on Wednesday I dropped into the project director's office to inform him that I wouldn't be around for the next few days. "Oh, yes," declared Mr. Lindley, "you're scheduled to take an Army pre-induction exam."

And just then, our old pal, Henry F. Halliday, assistant project director, casually mentioned that he had a few photos he would like to show. The snaps illustrated both the evacuee and appointed personnel members at work in the various administrative offices. And once again, my thoughts shot back to the moving picture that I had seen the night before. The evacuees at work were all girls with the exception being the appointed personnel workers. The local procurement, fiscal, time-keepers, cost accounting and other offices were simply staffed with feminine workers. Of course, there were a few cases here a male might be "pushing a pencil," but that was rare. And of those few exceptions, half of them were middle-aged men.

Mr. Halliday commented, "I took rather an informal survey, and to my amazement I discovered that majority of the girls just graduated from high school. It seems all the older ones have relocated. And as for male help, Uncle Sam has taken care of that matter pretty thoroughly."

Believed to be one of the first nisei GI Jane to enlist in the WACs, Iris received her basic training at Ft. Des Moines, Iowa; and in latter part of January, 1944, was transferred to Ft. Devens, Mass. There are two other nisei lassies stationed in Ft. Devens.

Private Watanabe, nattily clad in her WAC uniform, stated that among her daily training activities were drills, the well-known KP duties, physical training and parades. She is also a member of the WAC glee club, which combines with the Boston and Camp Edwards WACs to perform in major Massachusetts cities. This group has sung in the Boston's famed Symphony Hall.

Chicago Firms Seek Issei; Jobs Listed For Men, Women

A job of the month for men, issei preferred, has been announced by the Chicago metropolitan district relocation office calling for track laborers. The Illinois Central Railroad system which is the employer, is making the offer attractive by providing better than usual housing and offering board and room at lower than usual rates. Both experienced and inexperienced men are acceptable.

Rate of pay is 65 cents an hour with $1\frac{1}{2}$ for work over 8 hours in any one day. Comparatively low hourly rate is compensated by the low cost of board and room, which is 60 cents a day. Company will furnish laundry and modern sanitary facilities, and complete hospitalization and medical service at nominal cost.

A job of the month for women, issei preferred, is offered by the Chicago's Wimbledon Shirt company. This concern will hire 150 power machine operators, either experienced or inexperienced. Experienced women will receive \$35 to \$40 a week, and can convert to piece work and earn up to \$50 a week. Inexperienced women may start at \$28 a week and advance on qualification.

Other jobs listed are as follows:

Accountant, \$30 week and up; photographers, up to \$50 a week on ability; auto mechanics, \$1 an hour and up; bakers helpers, \$35-\$45 week for 48-hour week; machinists, 90 cents to \$1.25 an hour and up.

General clerical, 65-70 cents and hour; greenhouse workers \$30 a week, more for experienced men; nurserymen, 65-75 cents an hour; truck driver, \$49 a week for 50 hours.

Typists, \$20-\$30 a week; stenos, \$35 a week if experienced; floral designers, 60-75 cents an hour on ability; beauty operators, \$25-\$30 a week plus tips.

Farm offers of all types are on file. Further information may be obtained at the local relocation office. Jobs in other Midwest areas are also on file.

NISEI POTPOURRI

THE HUMAN COMEDY

NO doubt many of you have heard of William Saroyan. Well, the other night while carousing through some old Liberty magazines I came across a condensation of Saroyan's best selling novel, "The Human Comedy." I heard a great deal about it but never read it. But here was a condensed version and it said, "Reading time one evening." So I read it. Honestly, it was worth one evening to read this story.

Although it is a tale of poor but respectable California American family, the Macauleys, it has familiar ring of a typical California Japanese family with truly Americanized nisei children. I believe that is what makes the story so touching and human. It can apply to any family, regardless of ancestry, and it still remains as American as the hot dog.

THERE is one passage that should be read by all Americans. It is from a letter written by Marcus, who is in the Army, to his younger brother Homer. In it he writes: "I do not feel like a hero. I have no talent for such feelings. I hate no one. I do not feel patriotic either, for I have always loved my country, its people, its towns, my home, and my family."

I rather think that's the way most nisei feel, otherwise there wouldn't be so many nisei in the Army acquitting themselves nobly and valiantly. And others would have felt the same way if constant doubt of their loyalty and evacuation had not changed their attitude. There is nothing that breaks down a man's faith as to be convicted without a trial; to be so grossly misjudged on no evidence; to be continually looked upon by the misinformed people and the intolerants as disloyal.

They do not seem to realize that before this global war ends, there'll

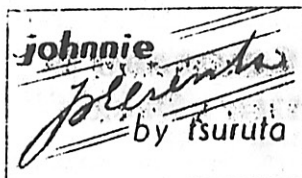
Three male cooks are needed at the hospital mess hall for immediate service, states Dr. William T. Carstarphen, chief medical officer.
