ASK SUPREME COURT TO LIFT COAST BAN

WASHINGTON--US Supreme Court was petitioned this week by the attorneys-general of California, Oregon and Washington to lift the West Coast civilian exclusion order against persons of Japanese ancestry, as soon as possible.

Joint petition was filed by the attorneys as friends of the court in the Fred Korematsu case and stated the high tribunal has emphasized in previous decisions that racial discriminations are prohibited, except in most unusual circumstances.

"It was reasonable for military commanders to meet the danger threatened (after Pearl Harbor) from unidentified disloyal members of the group by excluding the group as a whole," said the petition, but now "the restrictions...must be removed as soon as the military authority determines and the national security permits."

Evacuee Land Owners

DENVER--Out of 64 Japanese aliens who now own farm lands in Colorado, only nine have purchased their land since Pearl Harbor, revealed James H. Curtis, officer in charge of the local WRA office.

NISEI WITH MERRILL'S MARAUDERS IN BURMA

There are ample proofs trickling in that GI Japanese Americans are in there pitching in the Far Eastern theater of operations. Latest news coming in to public attention is the 14 Joe Nisei serving with Brig. Gen. Frank Merrill (Merrill's Marauders) in Burma.

Among the group is Sgt. Henry Goshu, formerly of Seattle, Wash., who says, "I am proud to say that 14

of us were one of the first elements of Merrill's Marauders to leave the States. We were...readily accepted and the importance of our work was recognized.

My baptism of fire came at Walawbeun (Burma) when our platoon was flanked on all sides by Japs. We were caught in a cross-fire of machine guns and all I got in this four hour battle was a bullet hole in my pant leg."

Distribute Co-op Checks

Distribution of patronage refund checks, as declared at the membership meeting held last Aug. 31, will begin next week, announced Akira Inaba, Co-op executive secretary, Thursday.

Coming cash refunds will be one-half of 10 per cent refund declared on total purchase made during the last fiscal year (Sept. 1, 1943-Aug. 31, 1944), while the remaining 5 per cent will be distributed before Christmas, Inaba assured.

FAVOR OUSTER OF JAPANESE

LOS ANGELES--Research Jury of this city disclosed that the proposal to ban Japanese subjects from the United States after the war by constitutional amendment has the backing of public opinion in Los Angeles county.

Approval of postwar deportation of Japanese nationals has grown in the last six months, the jury announced, but similar feeling against the nisei have somewhat subsided. This latest report issued to be the result of personal cross-section contacts with more than 1000 persons.

ESTHER'S LETTER

ESTHER TAKEI, our Girl Friday, came in for lot of publicity when she returned to Pasadena to continue her education. To me, her action was more than just that; it was to continue our fight to regain some of our citizenship rights. Not only in moral sense, but realistically--which is more important. And in the process Esther has absorbed plenty of heat generated by "small people" who are never satisfied.

Few days ago the staff received a long, interesting letter from her. It contained joy, gratitude, bewilderment, pathos, glowing gladness, and hope and hope. Let me elucidate:

SHE found great joy in once again setting foot on California soil; to be really home "with a feeling of 'everyday-ness.'"

She felt extreme gratitude for all the friendly welcome accorded her the very minute she stepped off the train. It was homecoming with all the trimming of glad tidings.

She was bewildered by all the publicity that grew out of her presence there. News, pictures, interviews, questions and such.

PATHOS

She suffered the pathos of having her name tossed "this way and that way" by individuals who tried so hard to make so much out of so little. Blasting her return as something verging on the atrocious, looking upon her as if a saboteur or a spy.

She experienced glowing gladness in the backing given her by servicemen of various ancestries--in person and by letters. Three marines from San Diego went to visit her. They assured her that "their entire camp was 100 per cent for the Japanese returning to California." One of them was a young Chinese of Sacramento, Calif., who said he knew a lot of nisei, one in particular--the Koikes of 9E here.

She's hoping to meet some of us out there because "nisei have many, many friends" in California, so she says "take the plunge and start life anew." "And very soon."

There you have it--not all the details, but in the main.

On less capable shoulders, I would feel uneasy about it all because California is still "California," but with Esther I feel safe that she will be a credit to us. She has already done us a great service. She will do more with her loyalty to her studies, friends and country.

CALL FORMER AMACHEAN "BABY SERGEANT YORK"

S/Sgt. Lenny Yasui, formerly of this center and Los Angeles, is known as "Baby Sergeant York" in the China-India-Burma theater of operations. Although only five feet two and weighing but 120 pounds, Sergeant Yasui is quite a man on the Irawaddy river front, having captured 16 enemy Japanese during mop-up operations after resistance collapsed.

A group of about 17 enemy Japanese were isolated on an island. Yasui and three Caucasian soldiers, volunteering to get them, swam over, where he took charge.

The Sergeant yelled to the Japanese hiding in the underbrush in Japanese to come out and surrender. The men hidden in the bush must have been stupefied to hear their native tongue, which Yasui had learned while a student at Waseda university, Tokyo. Instantly, a Nip sergeant

appeared, looking bewildered but impressed, and took Yasui on an inspection tour and out of many fox-holes jumped Nip soldiers, fully armed. He then asked for their arms and ordered them to line up.

Yasui solved the problem of getting the party across the Irawaddy by having the prisoners swim pushing a raft, on which he sat with two of the weaker prisoners at his side.

FIREMEN HAVE NEW MASCOT

A familiar sight at the fire house is the company mascot, a black and white Dalmatian dog, lolling in the doorway. When an alarm sounds, he jumps on the fire truck and rides off with the firemen. His presence means good luck to the boys.
