PROTESTS EVACUEE RELEASE

Speaking from his background of 10 prewar years as a newspaper correspondent in Japan and his subsequent observations, James R. Young gave a Fresno Town Hall Forum audience some information which should be an eye opener for Californians.

Moreover, at least one of his assertions should occasion either a confirmation or contradiction from official sources.

In protesting against the release of cuees by the Jar Relocation Authority until the War Department is prepared to guarantee safety from attack "west of the Mississippi," he said.

"We have been given to understand the FBI passes on the loyalty of those released from WRA camps. know positively, is not so!"

And that statement emphatically calls for a response from one or the other or both of the agencies mentioned.

The public, however, will prefer such from the FBI rather than by spokesmen for a setup concededly quite lenient toward its wards.

Amazing, too, is Young's claim that some 10 per cent of the 35,000 Japanese who colonized certain mandated Pacific islands -- which also were being fortified violation of treaties -- were former California farmers.
