
Applicants for USO hostess have come in such a drove that it was forced to temporarily discontinue accepting any more members, it was reported. It has an active list of 75 hostesses at present.

ASTROPOUAGUEYING TEST SET DUERE IFOR APPRIL 12

The Army Specialized Training Reserve program qualifying test will be held on Thursday, April 12, at the local high school, according to Miss Grace Lewis, school guidance counselor.

WRA says not all evacuees are eligible to return to the Pacific states The Army has excluded an undisclosed number from coastal areas, and others are not free to leave WRA supervision. Those who are not permitted to relocate will be transferred to Tule Lake se; regation center when the relocation conters are closed on Jan. 2, 1940.

The present Japanese population . of the United States, including those in the armed forces, approximates 133,000; according to the WRA census. The ei ht relocation centers and the Tule Lake Camp have about 79,000 inhabitants. and almost 37,000 have relocated. The remaining 17,000 are Japanes e who were living outside the Pacific coast military zone and were not affected by the WRA program.

OVER 2000 IN ARMY

Of the 33,000 who have resettled, 28,541 reported v luntar ly. The Army has more than 2,000, and a nother 2,000 are on indefinite leaves from the centers. whereabouts of nearly 4,500 of the evacuees who have left the centers are not definitely known.

Births at the eight centers, at Tule Lake, and at Jarome relocation center (now closed) totaled 4,837 through January. There were 1,3/5 deaths.

Col rado River relocation center (Poston) leads in number of relocatees with 5,773, while Minidoka and dila River centers follow in order with 4,853 ard 4,753 respectively. Departures from other centers are as follows: Heart Mountain, 4,188; Central Utah, 3,547; Rohwer 3,459, Granada 3,2/9; mazanar 2,533; Tule Lake 2,418, and Jerome (closed) 2,056.
