FEW EVACUEES RETURN WEST

LOS ANGELES--Only 1,438 persons of Japanese ancestry out of more than 10,000 evacuated from the Pacific coast states have returned to their former homes so far, stated Dillon S. Eyer, national WRA director, here recently. About 40,000 evacues have relocated in other states, he added.

In addition, 55,000 other have been cleared by the Army for resettlement in any part of the country, of which 20,000 are under 18 years of ago.

The director revealed that 1,196 have returned to California, 116 went to Oregon and 126 to Washington.

Approximately 580 evacuoes are now liming in Southern California, according to National JRA. Director Dillon S. Myor, who added that at least 12,000 will resettle in the area by the end of the year.

SPONSOR BULL TO EXTEND GI BILL OF RIGHTS TO WIDOWS

WASHINGTON -- Sen. Warren G. Magnuson, Democrat of Washington, recently introduced a bill to extend the education and loan benefits of the GI Bill of Rights to American Legion officials. widows of World War II servicement.

The proposal would make eligible widows of men who died in wartime active service to obtain Federal guarantees on private loans for home, farm or business of one half of the amount of loan up to \$2000.
