CAPTURE OF TURIN BY 442ND TOLD

ROME--The capture of Turin by the Japanese American troops was announced last Monday by Allied headquarters, according to INS report.

ROME--Gen. Mark Clark, 15th army group commander in Italy, announced the capture of Milan, Venice and Genoa, three of Italy's greatest cities.

The US Fifth Army entered Turin last Monday.

The 442nd Infantry, composed of American troops of Japanese descent, entered the great industrial city of 629,115 and found it completely under control of Italian patriots.

LIST SERVICES FOR NISEI GI DEPENDENTS

The American Red Cross home service division has sent instructions to every chapter--one in each county in the United States--in regards to the WRA's post-exclusion relocation program, pointing out how local Red Cross chapters can assist evacuee resettlers with family members in service.

Home service division workers have been advised to provide any needed service within their program to evacuees who are veterans, members of ex-servicemen's families, or members of families of active servicemen.

Importance of the home service providing reclassification of dependency allotments when servicemen's dependent families relocate was emphasized. Upon relocating, the family may be eligible a higher allotment.

HERE AND THERE

WE HAVE IN OUR OFFICE a "teletype" which is connected to various news sources. It is a contraption in the form of a very recalcitrant portable radio. Once it gets going it is a very efficient servant, but like all wartime servitors, it can get very stubborn.

Last Wednesday afternoon it was in a rare form, and through its voice "portal" passed one of the most welcome news in a month of Sundays. The news was the announcement of unconditional surrender of the German army in Italy.

No more shooting and no more casualties from enemy fire.

This was good news in many ways. But chiefly because the Fifth Army's 442nd Infantry was "spoonheading" the bitter show-down against the desperate Jorrios.

Relatives and friends of the men in the 442nd can feel thankful that the fighting in Italy is over.

SOMETIME AGO IN PARKER, ARIZ., a barber "kicked out" a disabled serviceman. And now comes to light another equally disturbing story from Indio, Calif. in Imperial valley where residents' temper at times gets as hot as the weather.

A soldier, winner of the Bronze Star and the DSC, went into a beanery there to satisfy his hunger.

The man behind the counter, after sizing up his would-be customer, said harshly:

"We ain't serving no Japs here."

Both of these battle-scarred veterans were refused service because they were American with Japanese faces. It must have hurt them deeply to be so mistreated.

But the story goes deeper than that because persons of Japanese descent have always suffered from discrimination. It shows that those self-styled barons of self-interest can't see the trees of democratic principles because they are lost in the forest of hate and racial intolerance. Their anti-Japanese feelings are so

アメリカ民権擁護協會 不忠誠解紮相違の論争支援

米國民権擁護協會は民権の擁護と確立に奮命中であるが、今回日系人の沿岸帰還除外令に關し左の如き書狀を寄せた。

西部沿岸に於て軍部當局が多数の日系人に對し、不忠誠に關する容疑を審査もせず、而かも其の大多數はFBIの身許調査後WRAに依り行動の自由を許容されてゐるにも不拘軍部に依り除外されてゐる事は洵に傷心の事實である。

斯の不忠誠に關する解釋の相違は軍事要域よりの除外若くは拘留に關する證明に甚しき障礙となるもので此は須く法廷に於て論争が然たらしむべき事項である。民権擁護に専念する本協會に於ては該問題に深き関心を持つ人々の要請に應じ、日本に帰國或は脱籍去國を申請せざる者又は質問答せざる者兩項にNOと記入せざりし者等の日系人にして前記の除外を受けし者を援助する為目下準備中である。尚本會では該條項に全然回答せざる者若くは先にNOと記入せしるも後日YESに変更したる者のケース等は法廷に於て論争するに充分なる理由ありと考慮してゐる。更に本會で接受した情報として転住所以外の地に居住せる者で未だ曾て居住した事無き西部沿岸より除外されてゐる者も相當ある模様で、斯かる人々は帝國又は脱籍を申請せざる場合或は不忠誠の確證無き限り、法廷に於て其の身許を説明する充分な余地がある。と信じてゐる。
