HOMORED NISEL

The current news brings an elequent reminder that Japanese American boys have not confined their Americanism to mero heroics; there has been heroism as well. Amorican soldiers of Japanese ancestry have suffered 2,111 casualties in the European war; 361 killed in action, 49 dead of wounds, 1,651 wounded, 34 missing and six captured. The last figure is interesting: not only the indoctrinated, fanatical island Japanese is hard to capture, but his "decadent" Americanized cousin as well.

It may be well: be that 'these casualty figures are heavior in proportion than American casualty figures at largo. Nor do casualty figures, possibly suggesting blind courage; tell the whole story; as early in June of last year nine out of ton men in the Nisei 100th Infantry Battalion had received Purple Hearts which, with 60 other decorations in the battation, bespoke the capacity to risk life intelligently and to military advantage.

All of those are cold figures recommended to the reflection of armchair hotspurs who would deprive all Japanese, Americans of their constitutional rights.
