

FOUR ATTEND CO-OP CONFAB IN SALT LAKE

Keisaburo Koda, chairman of the Co-op board of directors, Giichiro Mitani and Nobuhei Kurita, special representatives, left Saturday for Salt Lake City to attend a conference of the Federation of Center Business Enterprises, being held there this week, disclosed James G. Lindley, project director, Monday.

W. Ray Johnson, chief of community management, accompanied the trio, added Lindley.

It was reported that the conference discussion will center on liquidation procedures and problems.

NEXT SPECIAL COACH SET TO LEAVE HERE JULY 25

Wednesday, July 25, has been definitely set as the departure date for another California special coach to Sacramento and other Northern California cities, according to Mario Vecchio, assistant relocation program officer, Monday.

There were few more seats remaining on the special, although the car was nearly filled--as of Monday. If more returnees sign up, a second coach may be chartered, and if additional requests are made, another coach will be chartered for Sunday, July 29, added Vecchio.

Special coaches for Eastern cities are now being planned for next month.

ACCEPT NEW POSITIONS IN SEATTLE OFFICE

J. Ralph McFarling, community analyst, and Dr. Enoch Dumas, elementary school principal, tendered their resignations to accept positions as relocation officers in the Seattle (Wash.) district, according to James G. Lindley, project director.

Arriving in Amache in January, 1944, McFarling was with the family counseling unit before he succeeded Dr. John Rademaker as community analyst. He left the center last Sunday.

Dr. Dumas, who has been here since the start of the local education system, will depart for his new duties tomorrow.

SAYS FARM SITUATION IN COAST AREAS GOOD

Sentiment and general situation in agricultural sections in Northern and Central California are highly conducive to relocation, according to John N. Spencer, local chief of informative letters to Project Director James G. Lindley.

Spencer, who is on special assignment studying and investigating relocation possibilities and problems in California,

was impressed by the favorable reactions of the returnees who have resettled in their former homes.

He reports that work is plentiful, and generally the housing situation is not too difficult. Unlimited opportunities for returnees were cited by former Amacheans, but they were all reluctant to recommend the return of a friend or a relative to a prearranged location because they did not wish to be responsible should the prearrangement fail to suit the returning friend.

"This should not be misinterpreted to mean that something is wrong with the situation in California. Nothing could be farther from the truth," stated Spencer. Among the comments ex-center residents expressed are:

INSTALLATION ADDRESS TEXT

Following is the text of Project Director James G. Lindley's address in installing the new Amache Community Council on July 3 at the Town Hall:

The Organization Commission of Temporary Community Council in 1942 set forth the purpose and function of the council in part in these words: "To develop a democratic form of community government, to further the common welfare, to provide for internal harmony, to cooperate with the War Relocation Authority, and to establish a charter for community government."

I sincerely believe that for the period of 1942 to 1945 the purposes and functions of the community government, insofar as order, peace and harmony and an adequate charter were concerned, the council served its purpose. I have, however, at times felt that the common welfare of the people has often been neglected. I know and you know that the common welfare of the people cannot be and has not been attained to a satisfactory degree in the center. Individuals and families have lost ground. Initiative has not been properly pro-

"BREAK" FOR EVACUEES

TWO WELL KNOWN MEMBERS of the local appointed personnel—Dr. Enoch Dumas, elementary school principal, and J. Ralph McFarling, community analyst, have accepted positions as relocation officers with the WRA area office in Seattle, Wash. This is definitely a "break" for the evacuees who are contemplating resettlement in the Seattle area.

I don't profess to know just what inducements in emoluments and future stability, if there is such a thing in WRA jobs, were dangled in front of their eyes to make them "bite." But I assume there was something besides a change in climate—to make them forsake Amacho.

SERIOUSLY, I am inclined to believe that there is something more than meets the eye. I am of opinion that they are genuinely interested in the future welfare of the evacuees—especially those who are returning to the coast. And that they wish to contribute to the "come-back" efforts of the somewhat harassed returnees.

Giving a returnee his train fare and a small subsistence fund, getting him a job and a place to stay, if requested, doesn't exactly end the WRA's obligations to the returnee—not in the human sense. He needs something more than a free ride home, a place to stay, and an assurance that he won't starve for a week or so. He needs something to warm his heart, boost his soul and brighten his hopes—all this is just as important as filling his stomach. And to that end, a relocation officer who has the understanding of this need can best show his true worth to his job.

Because of this, I believe the Seattle returnees are very fortunate in having men like Dr. Dumas and Mr. McFarling to help them "make the grade." Their close associations with the evacuees here should prop-

Letter

TO THE EDITOR

TO THE FRESNO BEE:

Editor--Sir: I do not write in particular defense of our minority groups, be they Jew, Japanoso, Armenian or Negro but in defense of the Constitution of the United States. To be a native born American citizen honor us with all of its rights and prerogatives and impose upon us all the duties of an intelligent and informed citizenry.

We should stand ready and glad to defend the constitutional rights of even the humblest citizen regardless of race, creed or color. These rights are assumed to find protection in our courts of law hence the Multanon-Iwasaki-Crosby-Thucson episode at Parlior takes on a sinister aspect which forebodes trouble in future years. It represents a breakdown in our system of jurisprudence. We have in this case, as reported by the press, about 40 citizens of Parlior waiting upon Judge Crosby prior to and concerning the Multanon hearing, which apparently led Judge Crosby to characterize his decision--suspending sentence--as a "community arrangement."

One would like to think of Judge Crosby as having that native character, and courage sometimes called

only fit them for their new tasks. Their understanding of evacuee problems should make them more cognizant of the obligations they are assuming.

If the newly acquired jobs are giving them a "break," then by their acceptance they are giving the returnees a greater "break."

guts, which would have enabled him to stand up to his neighbors and tell them he would resign if necessary, but that he would not submit to any coercive interference with his duties as justice of the peace.

Of course, our system is wrong. We need to have men who meet certain standards of training and ability to fill these various offices. Our judiciary throughout the nation, and particularly in our inferior courts, is loaded with well meaning people who have small concept of the nature of justice.

We already have seen what may follow such lapses of justice as in the Multanon case. It happened in Parlior more recently, when one H. W. McCubbin, in broad open daylight, displayed a six gun in a most rude and vulgar manner--it would not shoot.

In this case, also, our district attorney filed his charge and made it stick, but McCubbin was not so lucky. He was tried before Judge Arthur C. Shepard, who sentenced him to six months in the road camp, plus a \$100 fine--sentence not suspended. We can readily imagine the fireworks if 40 Parlior citizens--or 400 for that matter--had called on Judge Shepard to work out a community arrangement of the McCubbin sentence.

I think the sorry performance of our district attorney was most notable in the Multanon case.

WASHINGTON--The War Relocation Authority was one of the few war agencies that did not feel the axe when the House war agencies appropriation bill was chopped down to a mere shell recently.

The WRA could have been eliminated by objection, since it is a war agency set up by presidential order and not authorized by Congress. No objection was made.

the task assigned us. At this date fifty per cent of the time has elapsed and we have completed only 30 per cent of the job. During the time remaining 70 per cent of the job has to be accomplished. It is my task, and, according to the preamble of the center charter, your task, to consider the common welfare of the residents.

It is my feeling that the leaders of this community can best serve the common welfare of the residents by assisting and encouraging all to relocate. Many of you plan to relocate in two or three months. Why not set an example by relocating next week? It is both possible and feasible for you to do so. Letters come to my desk almost daily from successful and happy relocatees, if all of you were successfully relocated you could be a great help in telling others to come on out. This has been the experience of such men as Robert Tashima and Robbin Kaneko of the last Community Council.

My specific charge to this, the sixth session of the Amache Community Council, is as follows:

1. Make definite, personal plans for relocation.
