Takata Elected N.H.S. President

At a recent meeting of the present active members of the National Honor Society of Amache High, Min Takata was elected president.

PLANS SET UP FOR LOCAL HI Y

On January 6th, representatives from the school boys' clubs, teachers, Caucasian personnel, churches, Y.M.C.A. and other organizations met in the conference room to form an organizing committee to start a Hi Y in Amache.

This group, meeting for the third time, decided to hold a mass assembly for all boys and people interested in forming a Y.M.C.A. here in Amache. This meeting is open to all and will be held in Terry Hall sometime in the near future. The Council Names will be taken of boys or clubs that would like to join. Up to date, there are four clubs signed up: The A.B.C., Royal Flushers, Royal Knights, and Royal Spartans.

At the meeting an advisory board was selected, and from this board the clubs will branch out.

Visiting the Amache schools for the first time on Monday and Tuesday of this week were members of the Amache Advisory School Board, which was organized at the first of December, 1943.

The Advisory School Board consists of Mrs. Inez Lewis, State Superintendent of Public Instruction; Rev. The purpose of their visit was to observe what was going on in the Amache Schools and discuss with the Education Administration Staff various possibilities for improvement of the educational program.

Mrs. Lewis and Mr. Betz visited Amache just on Monday, while Mr. Nelson and Reverend Waser visited on both Monday and Tuesday. Mr. Fox and Senator Gill were unable to come to the center.

Members of the board remarked that the educational program of Amache was very well organized and set up, and commended the work of the executive personnel and branches of the schools. They also commented that there was a very good school spirit and cooperation among the students of Amache High.

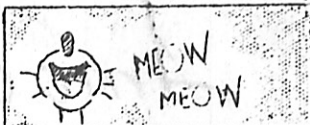
