#### Purpose of The Jr. High

by H. K. Walther (This is the first of a series of articles explaining the organization and the objectives of amache junior high school.)

The first junior high schools were established in California cities. Other cities soon followed, and today, in most large cities, junior high schools enroll the children who are in the seventh, eighth, and ninth grades.

They were established to provide a more gradual transitional period between the elementary and the senior high schools. Additional purposes of the junior high school areas follow:

1. To separate children who are approximately 12 to 15 years of age from younger and older cuildren whose interests are different.

To enable pupils to pass gradually from elementary to secondary subject matter without an abrupt break between the two.

To offer the pupils variety of exploratory subjects which enable them to make more intelligent selections of their high school courses and, ultimatel, to make wiser choices of their occupations.

To provide for selfexpression and individual differences through the medium of extracurricular activities and elective subjects.

The Amache junior high school day is divided into eight periods, beginning at 8:45 a.m. and closing at 4 p.m. Lunch hour is one hour and 15 minutes. Teachers are on duty from 3 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., six days a week.

Pupils are enrolled in the following subjects:

Mathematics, algebra, Junior business mathematics, science homemaking, indus-trial arts, physical edu-cation and health, art and crafts, music, and general education.


