## 30 VOCATIONAL AG BOYS LEAVE FOR MANCOS CAMP

Approximately 30 to 35 Vocational agriculture boys, accompanied by Lorenzo Burgert, secondary-school agriculture teacher, and Frank Watanabe, left the center yesterday morning for a ten-day stay at the CCC camp at Mancos, Colo., the camp at which 80 Amache Boy Scouts are now working.

The scouts are scheduled to return to the center tonight.

This group of the vocational agriculture boys will do work similar to that which the scouts have been doing--helping to dismantle an old CCC camp 30 miles west of Durango.

Declared John N. Spencer, chief of agriculture, "These boys have well earned this trip. For they have been of great help in farming 500 acres of Koen ranch."

## WAC OFFICERS RECALLED TO HEADQUARTERS

Lieut. Pegry Davies and 2nd Lieut. Thelma Thompson, WAC recruiters from Denver, were called back to Denver headquarters Thursday, but revealed before they left that local enlistment in the WAC will remain open indefinitely to girls who wish to apply at a later date.

Those who enlisted this week will go to Denver for their physical examinations within two weeks, with expenses paid, according to the recruiters. Girls who enlist later will go to Denver to take their mental alertness and physical examinations.

Said Lieutenant Davies, following this week's enlistment: "Those who have enlisted so far are very fine girls, and we will be happy to have them in the WAC. We are very sorry we must leave Amache at this time, but we will be able to return at a later date if there is a sufficient number of girls interested to warrant it."

Girls who wish to apply for enlistment in the WAC now or later may apply with Lewis Fanslan, assistant placement officer, who will forward the applications to the Denver recruiting headquarters.

## Further Plans Made For Fair

The coming Amache Agricultural fair of Sept. 11 and 12 will feature, in addition to its exhibit of many farm products, a regular country square dance, soft-drinks concessions and a baseball game between the local nine and a yet unannounced team from the outside, it was revealed yesterday by Joe McClelland, publicity chairman of the fair committee. It will be held in the new co-op building.

Plans are being made to invite some outside talent, familiar with square dances, to do the "calling" and "fiddling" and also to instruct the evacuees in the intricacies of this dance, McClelland added. The members of the administrative personnel will also take part in "swinging the partners around."

Donald Harbison, assistant project director, has been named as the temporary chairman of the Fair committee, with the following persons in charge of the respective sub-committees: Joe McClelland, publicity; John Spencer, rules; and Enoch Dumas, prizes.

Residents of the center are urged by the committee to enter into the competition for prizes products grown in their victory gardens.

## GRANADA CRIES FOR GUNGA DIN

The Public Works Section played the Gunga Din role Thursday afternoon.

About 2 p.m., a frantic call from the city of Granada rattled the phone in the division's office. The town water pump had broken down and no drinking water was available for the townspeople.

Within 20 minutes, three evacuee workers were on their way on water trucks and made door to door visits delivering the much-needed water to every house. Grateful Granadans came out with every kind of container--buckets, bottles, tin cans --and kept the workers busy until after 8 p.m.

## NEW GRANT RULES ISSUED

New instructions were recently issued by the WRA concerning the payment of grants for traveling and initial living expenses to evacuees leaving the center on indefinite leaves:

"Fare to the point of destination will be furnished...in the form of... a ticket or government request...."

"Three dollars a day for meals and expenses while enroute will be paid in cash before the evacuee leaves

the center.

"The grant for the initial living expenses...will be sent to the...evacuee by mail in care of the relocation officer.... The evacuee may call for the check in person or write the relocation officer asking to have it forwarded to him. Any checks not called for within thirty days will be returned to the project."

Neither the amount of the grants or the eligibility requirements are changed.

## RELOCATION



### On Our Birthday

A year ago yesterday the first contingent of evacuee workers numbering 212 arrived from the Merced Assembly center to help transform the wind-blown sagebrush hills into a living, thriving community.

From its meager beginning, Amache, still unchristened, quickly grew into a community of 7,107 persons by the end of September. Amache of today with trees planted by the evacuees in every block, flower and victory gardens between the rows of barracks, a highly publicized high school building standing on the hill, lawn covered administrative area, a spacious hospital to care for the ailing is in its physical aspects a far cry from the groups of incomplete blocks without lights, without water and without feeding facilities that greeted the evacuees a year ago.

But the change in Amache is not only physical. Most of the evacuees entered the center with a belief that this was to be home for the duration, that the aim of the WRA and the community was to attain self-sufficiency and set up industries contributing to the war effort.

This was not so--this is home, but only until enough courage can be summoned to leave Amache. The aim of the WRA is to help readjust the evacuees in new communities throughout the land.

Nearly 1,900 people left the center during the year, 1,100 on indefinite leaves.

More and more the evacuees will find a place in a bigger America than they have ever known. Relocation this year is a must for nearly all.

But for some, Amache is home. There is no overlooking the fact that a few will remain. For these few, efforts should be made to make the community more comfortable, more cheerful.

The center's first birthday was taken in stride without a break in the normal community activities which in itself is a sign of growing up. But if Amache is to continue to grow it will depend on every resident for a measure of a community is not only in its physical aspects but in the head and heart of its people.

REP. EBERHARTERCOMES TO DEFENSE OF WRA  
REFUTES COSTELLO'S CHARGES

WASHINGTON, Aug. 25--"I think it is better to let the WRA carry on unhampered by unfair criticism," said Representative Eberharter (D) of Pennsylvania, as he came to the defense of the WRA.

He declared that most of the statements in a house subcommittee report on the handling of Japanese Americans "are not proven." He also expressed the opinion that the WRA, considering the difficulties involved, had acted "efficiently and capably."

The Pennsylvanian, dissenting member of a three-man Dies subcommittee on un-American activities, issued a minority report describing the recommendations of his two colleagues. Chairman Costello of California and Representative Mundt of South Dakota, as "feeble" and "meaningless."

The majority report, approved by Costello and Mundt, said the WRA had released 23 members of the Butoku-Kai, an organization which it described as subversive youth branch of the Black Dragon society.

"It is worthy to note, Eberharter said, "that of all the evacuees released on both seasonal and indefinite leave by the WRA, numbering more than 16,000, no report of disloyalty or subversive activity has been made to the authority or to this subcommittee..."

CENTER RESIDENT INJURES  
BACK IN FREAK ACCIDENT

Jusuko Shingu, 8G-8C, suffered severe injuries of unknown extent with a possible broken back Wednesday afternoon, as the result of a freak accident in front of the center hospital.

Shingu, a 55-year-old issei, stood near Block 8C, hailed a coal truck enroute to the administrative area, and begged the driver for a ride to the center hospital. After refusing twice,

the driver finally consented, seeing that Shingu was in no condition to walk because of a painful leg.

Since another person occupied the front seat, Shingu was asked to ride in the back, and he complied. As the coal truck approached the hospital, the driver took a short cut to the clinic. At that point, the front-seat occupant accidentally pressed the dump lever with his foot, flipping Shingu out of the truck as the dump bed rose.

Simultaneously, the truck crashed into the telephone lines, severing communications to the hospital. Shingu was immediately hospitalized and is now under Dr. Yamada's care.

All this happened at the XY ranch several days ago, and it came about thusly:

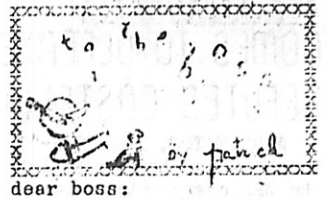

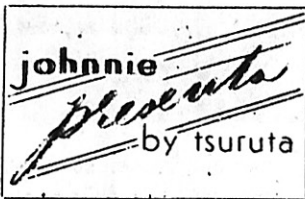
posing that the cow did think that), and then, after snorting a couple of times in true cow style, she aimed herself at the two creatures and started toddling, very fast-like.

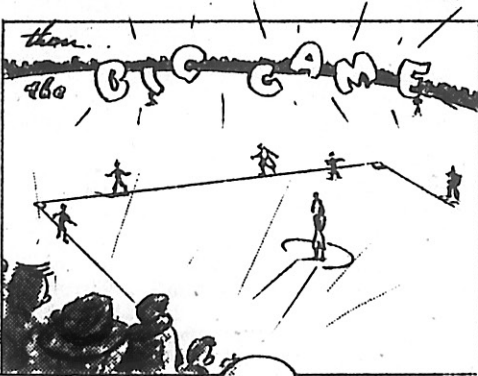
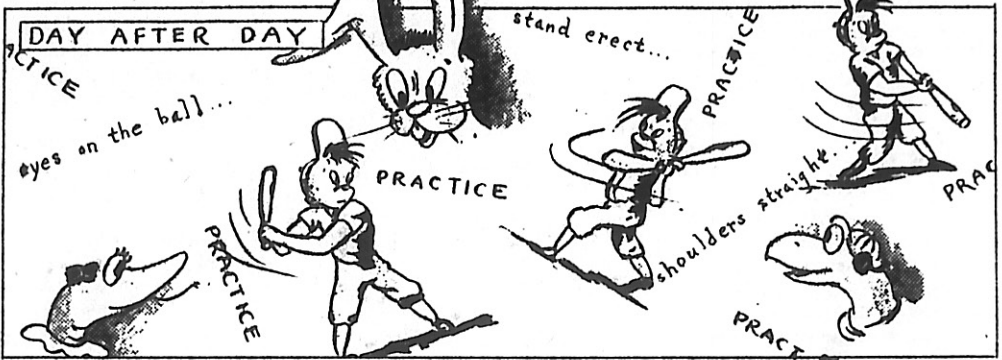

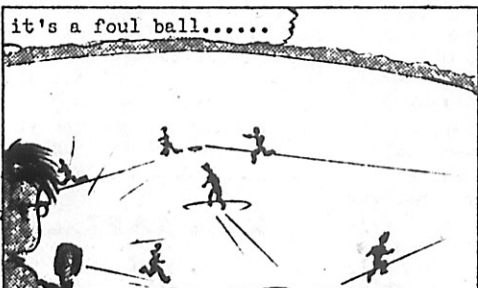

Next time you have occasion to enter the Procurement division, glance around the room and if you see a bespectacled, wavy-haired man bending over his desk, hard at work--that's David Nathan Katz. Who is he? Well, he's the man who purchases everything for the entire center outside of the Community Enterprises.

Most of his life has been devoted to government service--16 long years of efficient work in New Mexico. Those years weren't dull and drab ones. For instance, Katz was designated to locate runaway Navajo Indian girls from an Albuquerque school. He finally tracked them down, only to have them attack him with monstrous open safety pins; but Katz managed to herd them into the car for return. Another time he played Sherlock Holmes by uncovering a clue that led to the solution of the mysterious disappearance of a school teacher. The mystery was solved when he found the body in Beary canyon, N. M.

Practically all his years in government employment have been spent in supervising Indian agencies. Since his graduation from high school, he entered Indian service as a property clerk. Subsequently, Katz's uncanny ability enabled him to rise to many responsible positions. At one time, he was bonded for five million dollars worth of government property. In fact, in 1938 he flew to Washington for the purpose of studying all phases of the Indian bureau.

Memories he cherishes in the realm of sports are distinctive. He managed a basketball team that had Buster Charles, the famous Indian Olympic decathlon star. Another time he coached a high school football squad to the New Mexico state championship.

Bob Burns' may have his bazooka, but Katz has his musical saw on which he plays his favorite tune, "When Day Is Done." He eats and writes with his left hand, but uses his right for other purposes.--Sueo Sako

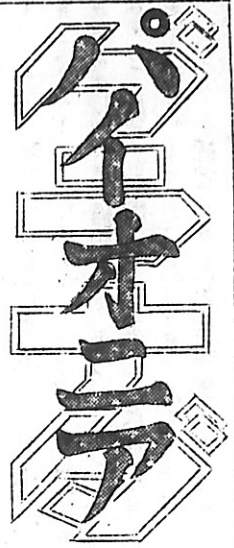
